# **Brecon Beacons**



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### General Summary for Wednesday, 1 May, 2024



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 1 May, 2024

East to southeast winds, mostly moderate in strength, will bring low cloud to eastern hills, but breaking up widely in the west with patchy sun. The legacy of a front will act as a focus for scattered heavy shower development, whilst an area of rain may spread in across parts of the east and Wales later in the day.

#### **Headline for Brecon Beacons**

Most low cloud clearing, then patchy sun. Risk of a few showers, or heavy rain later.

## Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 1 May, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Southeasterly between 10 and 20mph: generally strongest in the morning.	
Effect of wind on you?	Small	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk showers afternoon, and into evening a pulse of heavy rain.  Risk scattered heavy showers afternoon breaking out. These may give way to an area of heavy, perhaps thundery, rain from the east into the evening. There remains marked uncertainty over this through.	
Cloud on the hills?  Chance of cloud	Varied patches, but often clear  A few patches after dawn, banks of cloud mainly on east and southeastern slopes. Locally forming temporarily after rain. Hill fog may reform in any heavy rain that develops into evening.  70%

Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun and varied cloud. May turn overcast later in the day.  Excellent visibility.	
How Cold? (at 750m)	4C rising toward 10C

Effect of wind on you?	Locally very varied, but possible sudden buffeting making walking arduous in places not just on higher terrain.	May become increasingly blustery through the day.
How wet?	Periods of rain	Risk of rain, perhaps for much of the day.
(Precipitation and its impact)	Uncertain progress of a slow-moving front over Wales, may give several hours of rain, some heavier bursts from elevated cloud layers.	Large uncertainty: An elongated area of low pressure and its associated complex frontal zone, may drift across area to bring wet conditions for several hours.
Cloud on the hills?	Risk extensive	May well be extensive
	Risk of low cloud shrouding many hills for periods, most persistent eastern areas.  May vary during the day, filling in extensively around rain, but some periods where cloud largely above hills, best breaks in west. ### **Planning Outlook**

### All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 2 May, 2024

High pressure to the north and a slow-moving area of low pressure circulating to the south during midweek. Scattered showers possible for the Highlands, but a lot of dry weather - warmest and clearest in the west. Powerful easterly winds will be very gusty by Thursday into early Friday, especially Scotland and northern England, then easing. A front brings a risk of persistent rain for Wales on Thursday. Slow-moving weather patterns are likely to continue onward into the Bank Holiday weekend, giving considerable uncertainty of local day-to-day detail, but most likely the wind often light and fairly warm overall. A good amount of dry and bright weather, but risk of locally thundery showers forming.
