


# Brecon Beacons

Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales, including highest point in Preseli Hills.



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## General Summary for Saturday, 14 May, 2022



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 14 May, 2022

Low cloud and patchy light rain or drizzle affects western Scotland in the morning, but will break up with many mountains clearing across the Highlands. Breezy on Scottish hills, easing with time.

England and Wales generally dry with light winds, warm and sunny. Risk bursts of rain spreading from south into night for Wales.

#### Headline for Brecon Beacons

Increasingly sunny; beware sunburn. Light winds, feeling warm.

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 14 May, 2022

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Varied direction; 10mph or less.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Negligible.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No rain</b> Dry all day and evening. Well into the night, a risk of bursts of rain developing from the south.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Patches higher summits morning, all clearing</b> Patches of cloud for a few hours in the morning above about 700m, possibly 400m westernmost hills, will disperse.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>80% becoming almost certain.</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun morning, then extensive sun. Visibility good, but slight haze.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	9 rising to 13C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

## Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 15 May	Monday 16 May
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southeasterly 20 to 30mph.	South to southwesterly, 20 to 25mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Walking impeded where exposed on the hills. Sudden downslope gusts may affect your balance at times.</b>	<b>Blustery where exposed on higher terrain, ease of walking impeded on major summits and ridges.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Showery rain, mostly early and late</b> Showers or rain may develop for a few hours, most likely in the morning. Drier middle of day onward, then toward evening a risk of further bursts of rain returning from the south.	<b>Risk thundery downpours for a time</b> Overnight rain is likely to clear northwards by dawn. Heavy showery bursts forming for a few hours up to early afternoon, then likely fading. Risk of thunder. Further rain may return into late evening.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Cloud banks dispersing</b>  Areas of cloud on higher slopes in morning, particularly near showers. Most or all summits will probably clear during the afternoon from the south. Patches lowering again if rain returns later.	<b>Extensive, improving</b>  Blanket low cloud will be extensive for several hours during and after rain. Cloud bases rising, tending to break up toward higher slopes by afternoon. Patches may remain on western hills toward coast.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>20% rising to 70% in afternoon</b>	<b>10% rising to 60%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sunshine developing from the south by afternoon.	Overcast start, sun breaking through, perhaps increasingly sunny in afternoon. Visibility poor around rain, becoming good for periods; slight haze.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	9C rising to 12C by afternoon.	9 to 12C, coolest if in fog.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above summits	Above summits

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 15 May, 2022**

South to southwesterly winds will prevail into early next week, bringing some spells of rain or showers, including a risk of thundery bursts in places. Wind speeds varied, sometimes reaching gale force on the tops. Rain and low cloud becoming focused on western mountains in Scotland as the week progresses, with generally westerly winds from midweek, feeling quite cool on the mountains. Higher pressure building across England and Wales should bring fewer showers and some warmer, sunnier periods. High pressure may then expand further north over Britain into next weekend.
