
Brecon Beacons

Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales, including highest point in Preseli Hills.

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General Summary for Thursday, 7 July, 2022



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 7 July, 2022

Scotland: Low cloud extensive west/northwest Highlands with drizzle toward west coast; more widely developing western hills later. Cloud breaking up to sunshine in the east.

England and Wales: Low cloud and patchy drizzle mostly clearing to sunshine, but may linger some western hills.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Early low cloud and patchy drizzle clearing with sunshine breaking through.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 7 July, 2022

How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly typically 15mph.	
Effect of wind on you?	Small	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk drizzle toward Cardigan Bay All or nearly all areas dry. But risk on Western slopes of Cambrian mountains and Preseli of pockets of fine drizzle.	
Cloud on the hills?	All or nearly all clearing Initially very varied: fog may cover some areas from lower slopes upward, whilst other areas are cloud free. From mid morning, cloud free almost everywhere, but cloud at 200-400m may come and go on slopes nearest Cardigan Bay.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine soon extensive and visibility excellent. Possibly dull slopes nearest Cardigan bay.	
How Cold? (at 750m)	15C afternoon.	
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Cloud on the hills?	Early low cloud breaking and clearing.	Hills soon clear
	Early banks of low cloud across higher slopes will break up and widely clear through the morning.	Any early banks of low cloud will soon clear to leave the hills widely free of fog.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%	Lifting to 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine increasingly breaking through, perhaps widely. Visibility becoming good or very good.	Sunshine becoming fairly widespread. Visibility becoming good or very good.
How Cold? (at 750m)	15C	11C lifting to 15C
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 8 July, 2022

Persistent high pressure off SW Britain will bring extensive dry weather to and through next weekend, although in western Scotland, with the wind off the sea, often cloudy and fronts may bring rain on Sunday. On western mountains the cloud will bring persistent fog until Friday, even to lowest slopes near the coast. However,

remaining murky toward west coast of Scotland with further drizzle at times.
