

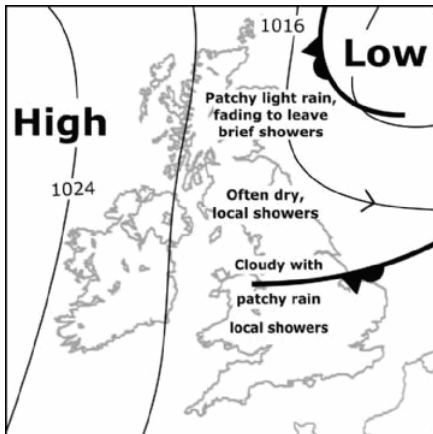
# Brecon Beacons

Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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## General Summary for Thursday, 11 July, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 11 July, 2024

Extensive cloud, more frequent rain in the morning on Snowdon range and in the Cairngorms. Sunny spells likeliest on the western Scottish coast. where cloud may lift during the day above most hills, leaving highest Munros in clouds. Windy on the eastern Highlands. Mostly cool temperatures.

Mostly cloudy, locally showers

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 11 July, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Variable 10-20mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Fairly small.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Showers afternoon possible</b> Mostly dry morning, drizzly showers possible in West Wales. By the afternoon scattered showers accros the regions
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive fog morning; cloud base gradually rising</b> Extensively foggy start, cloud on many lower slopes west Wales. Will slowly improve as cloud base rises above 650m, and later 800 or 900m.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>30% rising to 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly cloudy only occasional sun. Visibility excellent.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	9 to 11C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

	<b>Friday 12 July</b>	<b>Saturday 13 July</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northerly, 10 to 20mph.	Northwesterly 10 to 20mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly small, but feeling distinctly cool for July on higher exposed summits.</b>	<b>Small, almost negligible.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Local showers</b> Possible showers early in the day, mainly drizzly and toward west coast. By afternoon, localised showers forming inland, drifting south with time, risk of an isolated heavier burst.	<b>Showers mostly west. High uncertainty</b> Brief, mostly light showers over some mountains. High uncertainty for the details. Higher risk over the western coast.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Patchy cloud lifting</b>  In the morning, varied patchy low cloud plus some mist in the valleys. Some tops briefly above the clouds. Patches drifting upslope for a time, but largely cloud lifting and widely breaking. Fragments lower near showers.	<b>Hills mostly clear</b>  Clouds may shroud at times the hills by the Cardigan Bay. Elsewhere mostly clear.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>50% rising to 80%</b>	<b>70%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun and clouds, filling in a little inland; sunnier west coast later.  Very good visibility.	Frequent sunny spells, maybe more often interrupted by clouds on the Western Cambrian Mountains.  Mostly good visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	8 to 10C. In the breeze, feeling like 3 to 5C on higher terrain.	11 to 14C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits	Above the summits

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 12 July, 2024**

Extensively dry over the next few days, although with one or two 'shallow' areas of low pressure close to Britain, rain is likely for a few hours in some areas - or sometimes afternoon heavy showers. Generally winds light; some sunshine, but overall fairly extensive cloud. A little less cold.
