

General Summary for Friday, 11 April, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 11 April, 2025

Most places remain dry, sunny and very warm. Some thin high cloud, plus haze lower down, but most hills free of cloud. Northwest Scotland is likely to see low cloud push onto coastal hills on a fresh westerly breeze. Lightest winds toward Wales.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Sunny and warm. Light wind.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 11 April, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Generally easterly though variable, 10mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain
Cloud on the hills?	None expected
Chance of cloud free summits?	Nearly certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine and some thin high cloud. Early patchy low-level mist clearing to leave good visibility, but a slight haze. Possible coastal mist near Cardigan Bay in the morning, clearing with time.
How Cold? (at 750m)	9C rising to 12C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits. Local slight frost inland valleys at dawn.

How wet?	Chance a burst of rain	Showery rain
(Precipitation and its impact)	Spots of rain here and there from noon through the afternoon, chance of local brief heavier bursts for a time - details uncertain.	Several bands of showery rain push east through the day.
Cloud on the hills?	Little cloud expected	Lifting to highest tops, sometimes above
	Mostly clear, cloud bases briefly lowering to high tops in rain.	Fairly extensive upper slopes near dawn, some down to mid slopes west. Bases soon rise to high tops, sometimes lifting off tops through the afternoon. Some variability as showers come and go.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	30%, rising to 60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	A veil of high cloud thickens through the morning, little or no sun in afternoon. Good visibility, some haze.	Glimpses of sun, becoming more frequent later afternoon. Visibility becoming good, though poor in showers.
How Cold? (at 750m)	9C, rising slightly	4 to 5C, easternmost hills slightly warmer. A cooling trend in the later afternoon, most areas lowering towards 3C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 12 April, 2025

Grassland is now extensively very dry leading to significant risk of fire. Lowering pressure this weekend and a cold front coming in from the west to bring some rain, then showers which are likely to become heavy for Scotland on Sunday. Low pressure will become dominant into early next week. Wetter conditions will prevail for a few days through the week as complex areas of low pressure circulate slowly around the British Isles, bringing cloud and spells of rain and showers, at times heavy, though day-to-day detail is very uncertain. Temperatures will be generally cooler with less daytime fluctuation.
