

General Summary for Saturday, 17 May, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 17 May, 2025

Strong sunshine for the Highlands, Lakes and much of Wales all day; beware sunburn. Cloudy for the Pennines to the Borders in the morning, gradually dispersing to give sunshine into afternoon; feeling cool here with a fresh NE'ly breeze, strong and gusty in the morning. Warmest in western Scotland.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Largely sunny, cool start, becoming fairly warm. Gusty in places.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 17 May, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	East to northeasterly 10-20mph, strongest around dawn and dusk. Notable gusts on high terrain and downslope in the south for a time, up to 25mph.	
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small though often gusty, perhaps some stability challenges in strongest gusts.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain	
Cloud on the hills?	None west, soon clear east	
	Patches of cloud on some eastern slopes early in the day, soon all dispersing.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive strong sunshine after early cloud disperses in east. Soon excellent visibility.	
How Cold? (at 750m)	8C, rising to 13C	
Freezing Level	Above the summits

	Sunday 18 May	Monday 19 May
How windy? (On the summits)	North-northeasterly 10-15mph.	Easterly 15 to 20mph, in places gusty 25mph, mainly morning.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible	Fairly small, but feeling chilly where exposed especially morning, gusts may make walking uncomfortable locally.
How wet?	Little or none	Risk showery rain, possible thunder
(Precipitation and its impact)	Small chance toward evening of an isolated shower inland.	An odd spot of rain from time to time, locally a heavier burst. Some uncertainty, but may develop later in day widely into slow-moving areas of showery rain, chance of an isolated thunderstorm; hit and miss.
Cloud on the hills?	Not expected	Only if rain occurs later
		If showers occur, cloud banks forming and lowering onto tops, patches may form in places to lower elevations for periods.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive warm sunshine. Some high cloud builds later in the day. Excellent visibility.	Sunshine best in morning, cloud bubbling up during the day, may fill in later inland. Visibility excellent.
How Cold? (at 750m)	9C rising to 13C	7C rising to 12C afternoon; lowering a few degrees if showers develop.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 18 May, 2025

High pressure remains to the north into early next week, easterly breezes prevailing. A few showers are possible mainly England and Wales. Warm sunshine most abundant in western Scotland. A change in the weather pattern is expected from midweek as pressure generally falls, bringing a greater risk of showers or areas of rain - a more unsettled outlook onward into next weekend with cooler temperatures, often stronger winds and cloud shrouding the hills for periods. In the short-term, ground conditions remain extensively dry, water courses are very low and the fire risk is very high.
