

General Summary for Sunday, 2 November, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 2 November, 2025

Showery westerly winds, reaching gale force Scottish Highlands where cold enough for snow on higher tops. The rain will be almost constant NW Highlands, whilst from southern Scotland southward, showers will become well scattered. Least windy south Wales.

Blustery higher slopes. Showers. Cold.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 2 November, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 25mph.	
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	A few showers Showers from time to time, fairly brief.	
Cloud on the hills?	Frequently covering higher tops	
	Cloud widely covering the hills after dawn. Cloud base will rise through morning to around 800m, but temporarily lower near showers.

How Cold? (at 750m)	4C. Will feel as cold as minus 5C directly in the wind.

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 40mph.	South to southwesterly 35mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Arduous to difficult conditions on higher areas and significant wind chill.	Continued arduous walking where exposed on higher areas, where wind chill will be considerable.
How wet?	Rain most of the day	Frequent or persistent rain.
(Precipitation and its impact)	Rain and drizzle frequently through the day, least wet north from Black mountains.	Rain most or all day particularly south Wales. Very wet underfoot and streams in spate.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive	Very extensive.
	Widely shrouding the mountains from 200 or 300m up, although 450m mid Wales, and perhaps 600m Black Mountains.	Widely persistent fog above 200 to 400m Preseli and south of the A40. Generally, higher cloud base elsewhere, but rarely above 500 or 600m.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost nil	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensively dull and misty with visibility poor in heavier rain.	Little if any sun: mostly dull and misty. Perhaps glimpses of sun mid Wales.

750m)	Feeling at or below freezing in direct wind.	Will feel near freezing point directly in the wind.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 3 November, 2025

A series of deep Atlantic lows and associated fronts will continue to cross Britain over the next week to ten days. Frequently windy, and high rainfall, particularly on western mountains (rain at some stage almost daily) and cloud will frequently cover higher areas. Only rarely cold enough for snow higher mountains in Scotland.
