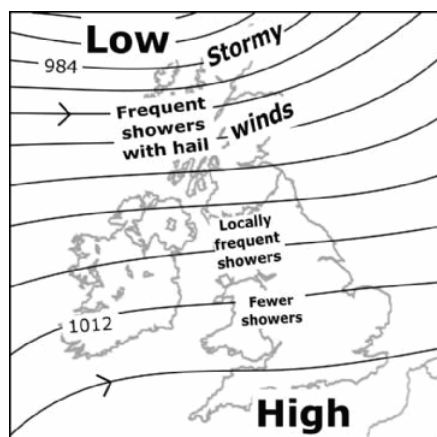

### General Summary for Wednesday, 10 December, 2025



#### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 10 December, 2025

Storm-force winds continue over Scottish mountains, beware of storm damage and blocked routes. Gales remain severe over high terrain in northern England and tops in north Wales. Showery rain, hail and on higher tops snow in the Highlands, near-constant in the west. Bands of showers northern England, fewer for Wales.

#### Headline for Brecon Beacons

Upland gales. Some showers mainly west.

### Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 10 December, 2025

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwesterly 35 to 45mph, tending to moderate a little into afternoon.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Challenging walking conditions over the hills with frequent buffeting; considerable wind chill.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Occasional showers</b> Patchy showery rain mostly west and southwestern areas. Wet underfoot, streams in spate, some flooding following previous rain.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Mostly higher western tops</b> Cloud base varying, mostly confined to upper slopes, most common toward western areas.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>60%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun mostly eastern mid Wales. Slight haze, but visibility mostly fairly good.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	4 or 5C, rising slightly into evening-night. Wind chill feeling like -7C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

**All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 11 December, 2025**

Staying unsettled as southwesterly winds prevail and low pressure systems pass to the northwest of Scotland; sustained gales over the mountains, severe or stormy for periods. Temperatures only just below freezing intermittently on higher Scottish tops, even here will experience spells above freezing with thawing, any lying snow patchy, but beware some icy surfaces on the very highest tops where some refreezing occurs. Driest in eastern areas on Thursday, otherwise rainfall will be frequent and heavy, sometimes showery with hail. Expect wet ground conditions and further flooding of streams and some rivers.

Forecasts are issued daily by 16:30 and are kept under review and amended as necessary. However, expected conditions can still change after issue. © Copyright Mountain Weather Information Service, 2025.
