

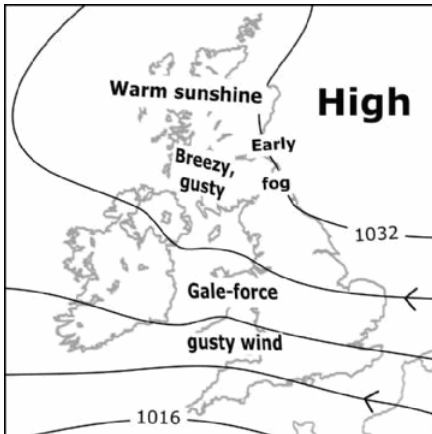
Brecon Beacons

General Summary for Wednesday, 29 April, 2026



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 29 April, 2026

Dry with extensive strong sunshine all day, beware sunburn. Patchy low-level fog soon clearing early morning. Fairly light wind for much of the Highlands, but gustier further southwest. Strong and gusty easterlies for England and particularly Wales, powerful gale-force gusts downslope in places.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Windy, gales around the hills, powerful gusts. Sunshine.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 29 April, 2026

| How windy? (On the summits) | Easterly 40 to 45mph; frequent gusts 55mph around high tops, through passes, locally downslope to west, strongest speeds not necessarily on summits. Evening onward, speeds and gusts increase further, over 60mph. |
| Effect of wind on you? | Arduous walking most of day with notable wind chill despite mild temperatures; sudden buffeting in places, not just on the tops, strongest gusts making balance difficult, you may be blown over. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | No rain expected |
| Cloud on the hills? | Soon none Brief patches of cloud from dawn on some eastern slopes, this soon dissipating for cloud-free hills. |
| Chance of cloud free summits? | Above 90% |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Widely sunny; some thin high cloud later. Very good visibility. |
| How Cold? (at 750m) | 5C rising to 10C. Directly in strongest wind, feeling like -8C early in day, -2C afternoon. |
| Freezing Level | Above the summits. |
