

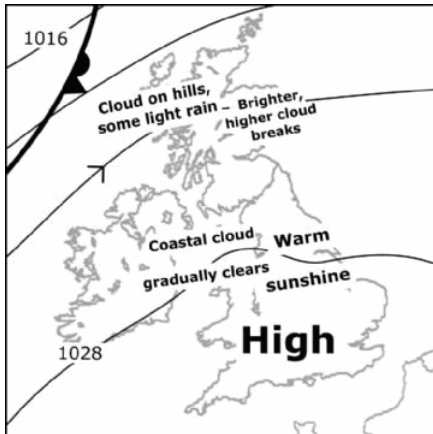
Brecon Beacons

General Summary for Saturday, 23 May, 2026



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 23 May, 2026

Scotland: Gusty south-westerly will feed extensive low cloud and patchy drizzle into the west. Mostly dry for eastern hills where cloud will lift and break off the hills.
 England and Wales: Low cloud and local drizzle morning western hills, mainly coasts, but burning off to leave warm sunshine widely.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Early low cloud or mist disperses. Then sunny and increasingly warm. Light winds.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 23 May, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 10mph and often less, trending variable.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Likely dry Chance of some early fine drizzle over high summits, this soon fading after sunrise for dry hills.
Cloud on the hills?	Early low cloud south, hills clearing Low fog on the southern slopes, perhaps up to 600m (chance of tops above a layer of cloud, but uncertain); may be more extensive Preseli. Cloud lifts through morning, likely above summits and well broken by afternoon.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Rising to 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny, some patchy higher cloud at times. Good visibility, but may be hazy in the distance to the south.
How Cold? (at 750m)	12C with little change in height early; rising to 16C (to a warm 24C eastern valleys). Only slight drop into nighttime.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Dry	Dry
Cloud on the hills?	Mountains clear Aside from some patches of banks across coastal hills early in morning, which will burn off, hills are expected to be clear.	Mountains clear Any early mist will soon disperse to leave the mountains clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	Greater than 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Widely sunny. Visibility very good.	Widespread and strong sunshine. Good visibility, but slight haze.
How Cold? (at 750m)	13C lifting to 17C	19C, very humid
Freezing Level	Well above the summits	Well above the summits. Valley temperatures reaching the high 20s.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 24 May, 2026**

Pressure builds this weekend, centred over England and Wales where it will be warm and sunny. To the north of the high, a blustery and gusty south-westerly will persist across the Highlands with patchy rain and hill fog, mainly in the west and northwest. Very warm by Sunday and Monday valleys of Wales and England, mid to high 20s. Low 20s glens into southern and eastern Scotland. Next week, high pressure extends over Scotland, cutting of the low cloud and drizzle from northwest Scotland by midweek with warm sunny weather, cooler in the north and east coast. Still very warm into the valleys of England and Wales with extensive sunshine.
