

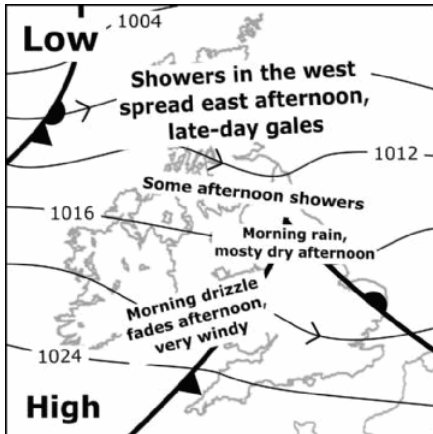
Brecon Beacons

General Summary for Friday, 12 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 12 June, 2026

Strong wind for all. Showers and fog in west Scotland all day, passing east afternoon, persistent for a few later hours. Gales into Scotland from the west late afternoon into evening. Morning rain, drizzle, and fog in England, easing afternoon, driest S Pennines. Drizzle in Wales fades afternoon, sun glimpses break out.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Morning drizzle gradually fades; often foggy, strong wind

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 12 June, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly 30-35mph, regularly reaching 40mph over high tops, and even stronger gusts early, up to 45mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Blustery over the hills, more strenuous in places where exposed, early gusts require significant effort to maintain stability. Feeling cool despite fairly mild air.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Drizzle, fading through afternoon Feeling damp over many hills with drizzle in the air, most common western Cambrians. Patchier drizzle further south and eastwards, and the drizzle tending to fade widely through afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, lowest west Persistent across the hills, foggy from lower elevations upward toward the west coast, cloud base rarely above 500m western Cambrians. Some higher bases east and southwards, occasional breaks above 600-700m, best chance late in the day.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, glimpses of sun mostly towards mid-Wales late afternoon. Misty west Wales hills, reduced widely in drizzle and haze; better eastwards.
How Cold? (at 750m)	10 or 11C, reaching up to 12C east hills afternoon. Likely cooling several degrees overnight. Feeling near or below freezing in strongest wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Northwesterly 15-25mph, some stronger gusts over tops early; an easing trend later. Fairly small, may be blustery in exposure early in the day.	Northwesterly 15mph at dawn, gusting 20 over high tops, easing and becoming variable, 10mph or less. Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Likely dry A few odd spots of drizzly rain may drift in from the northwest, but probably entirely dry.	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Early cloud largely breaks up Many slopes above 500-600m shrouded from dawn, bases soon lift but some lower banks of cloud cling to north and western areas for a time. By afternoon, only passing caps over tops. Rising to 70%	Probably clearing hills Some patchy mist in sheltered valleys at dawn, some variable ribbons of cloud from middle northern slopes upward as well; many areas start clear. Cloud lifts through morning, mostly dissipating too, for cloud-free hills. Rising to 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun increasingly breaking out, perhaps a mostly sunny afternoon, some high cloud around. Good visibility, perhaps a light haze.	Sun increasingly breaks out but may be weakened by high cloud. Very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m) Freezing Level	9 or 10C, rising to 13 or 14C. Above the summits.	11C rising to 15C. Southern slopes may be a degree warmer. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 13 June, 2026**

Higher pressure to the southwest this weekend, bringing warmer and drier conditions to Wales. Showery rain affecting Scotland on Saturday, some patches reaching northwest England; staying very windy and cool in Scotland and northern England on Saturday too. Sunday will be a clearing day for most: early rain in Scottish Highlands easing and most cloud lifting off summits, sunshine but weakened by high cloud. Temperature more widely mild, warm in Wales.

Into next week, a mixed southwesterly pattern remains, windy at times with periods of rain, drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west. Warmest in England and Wales, but cooler westerly air likely returns at times mid-late week.

Pressure generally trending higher, but extensively settled weather may remain elusive in the near-term.
