

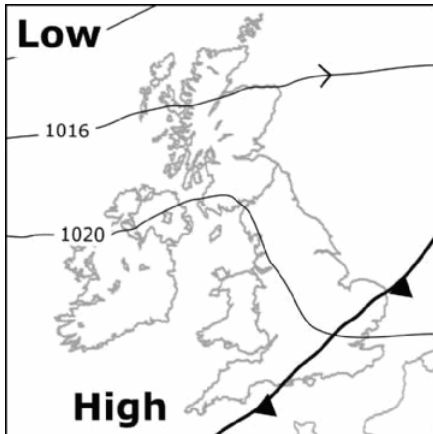
Brecon Beacons

Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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General Summary for Saturday, 20 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 20 June, 2026

Windy with a few drizzly showers and low cloud N and W Scotland. Elsewhere, fairly light wind (particularly Wales and S Pennines), and extensively dry. Widespread fog will clear most summits - although patches of fog lower slopes near some west coasts.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Fog, all or almost all clearing the hills. Light wind.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 20 June, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwest to westerly 5 to 10mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Soon dry Chance only of light drizzly showers after dawn and possibly the odd patch persisting Preseli. Otherwise soon dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Mountains starting foggy, but clearing - except perhaps westernmost slopes Morning: Improving markedly as fog across the hills gradually lifts and clears. All or nearly all summits then cloud free. However, coastal cliffs and slopes, mainly Preseli, & possibly westernmost slopes of Cambrian range may see pockets of fog at times persist below 300m. (Higher areas above the fog).
Chance of cloud free summits?	20% rising to be almost certain by about midday
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun developing. Visibility excellent.
How Cold? (at 750m)	11C morning; rising, particularly well inland as high as 16C afternoon.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 21 June	Monday 22 June
How windy? (On the summits)	East to southeasterly or variable, often 10mph or less.	South to southwesterly between 15 and 25mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.	Fairly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Chance of odd spots from high cloud, possibly a very remote brief burst of rain mainly in afternoon.	Risk thunderstorm Confidence low: it may remain dry. But risk of a few bursts of rain, perhaps brief although later in day thunderstorms may develop.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear	Very little for most of the day - may form in rain. Generally the hills free of cloud although fog may form higher slopes in rain.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Periods of sunshine weakened or giving way at times by areas of high cloud. Visibility excellent or superb although some haze later in day.	Patches of sunshine although extensive high level cloud. Visibility good, although a haze.
How Cold? (at 750m)	13C at dawn, rising to 20C afternoon.	21C - very warm and also very humid indeed.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 21 June, 2026**

Extensively dry and very warm indeed England and Wales although around Monday chance of thunderstorms. Rain and low cloud at times Scotland, mainly affecting western mountains - although later next week the warmth further south may penetrate north into or perhaps to all Scotland.
