

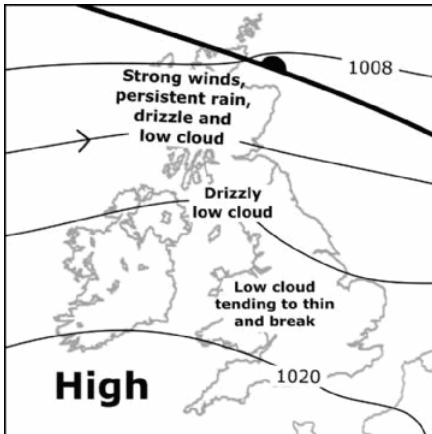
# Brecon Beacons

Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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## General Summary for Monday, 6 July, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:**  
**Based on forecast chart for noon 6 July, 2026**

Windy and generally wet across Scottish hills, rain and drizzle most persistent in northwestern Highlands. Breezy, damp and drizzly too for northern England. Drier and lighter winds for Wales. Poor visibility with low cloud cloaking many hills through the day, best of any breaks toward east.

**Headline for Brecon Beacons**

Breezy, gusty in places. Low cloud tending to lift and break.

## Detailed Forecast for Monday, 6 July, 2026

| <b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>                | Westerly 20 to 25mph, notable gustiness on higher terrain, to 30mph or briefly stronger in morning.   |

| <b>Cloud on the hills?</b>                        | <b>Varied banks upper terrain</b><br>Variable banks of cloud above the middle slopes in the morning, most extensive towards Cambrians. Summits locally between/above cloud layers. A lifting trend and largely breaking for clear hills, though patches drifting over high summits from time to time. |
| <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>              | <b>40% rising to 70%</b>  |
| <b>Sunshine?</b><br>Air clarity (below cloud)     | Regular bursts of sunshine by mid-morning, more extensive later, but weakened by thin high cloud.<br>Misty start in west, improving to very good visibility out of cloud.   |
| <b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>                        | 13C rising to 16C, coolest north and west of high tops; reaching 18C southeasternmost hills.  |
| <b>Freezing Level</b>                             | Above the summits.  |

| <b>Cloud on the hills?</b><br><br><b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b> | <b>Early varied cloud largely clears</b><br><br>Varied banks of cloud in the morning in several layer, high tops near or above cloud layers. Banks lift somewhat through morning but will largely dissipate with time, largely clear afternoon.<br><br><b>Rising to 90%</b> | <b>Hills clear, some west coast fog</b><br><br>Some possible fog near Pembrokeshire coasts may drift onto some low-level hills for a time, but most high terrain clear all day.<br><br><b>90%</b> |
| <b>Sunshine?</b><br>Air clarity (below cloud)                          | Glimpses of early sun, becoming extensive with time.<br>Very good visibility.   | Sunshine and thin fair-weather cloud.<br>Visibility very good.  |
| <b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b><br><br><b>Freezing Level</b>                | 13 to 15C, rising to 17C, little change with added, height, tops start warmer.<br><br>Above the summits.  | 15C rising to 19C afternoon.<br><br>Above the summits.  |

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 7 July, 2026**

A damp start westerly pattern continues at the start of the week, particularly in Scotland, then a drier and warmer window builds into the middle of the week: very warm in England and Wales, spells of sunshine spread northward, and lighter wind. Some patchy rain continues through late week in western Scotland though detail is uncertain and more often dry. High pressure is indicated to expand across Scotland through next weekend bringing more widely dry and warm conditions in the extended outlook into mid July - easterly winds likely develop, particularly England and Wales; a chance of some thunderstorms.
