

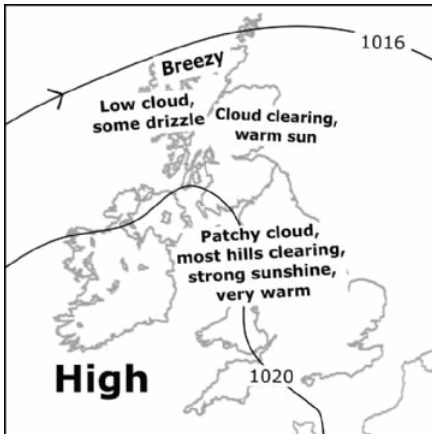
Brecon Beacons

General Summary for Wednesday, 8 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 8 July, 2026

Damp with blanket low cloud in W-NW Scotland, gusty locally. Highest Scottish tops may emerge above the cloud. Drizzle on western slopes easing, cloud thinning and breaking for central and southwest Scotland, sunnier and warmer overall in east. Very warm to hot sunshine for England & Wales.

Headline for Brecon Beacons
 Hot and sunny. Light wind.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 8 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 10 to 15mph or often less southern areas.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear, some west coast fog Some possible fog near Pembrokeshire coasts may drift onto some low-level hills, mainly later in the day and onward into night.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine and thin fair-weather cloud; high UV, beware sunburn. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 750m)	16C rising to 19 to 21C afternoon, warmest southeast tops. (Some valleys approaching 30C toward southeast, widely over 25C).
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

How windy? (On the summits)	Variable direction 5 to 10mph.	Southeasterly or variable, 10-15mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Most likely dry Late in the day, chance of a very isolated burst of rain, low risk a thundery downpour.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear Some coastal fog may affect lowest slopes near the sea, possibly also some mist inland valleys at dawn, but the hills clear.	Hills clear
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Generally sunny, thin high cloud. Visibility very good, some low-level haze, or possible fog near the coast.	Strong sunshine, some thin high cloud, may build across the sky later. Visibility good, but some haze especially eastern areas.
How Cold? (at 750m)	16C rising to 22C afternoon.	18C at dawn, rising to 24C, very warm and rather humid especially in west and south. (Valleys rising to 30C+ afternoon)
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 9 July, 2026

Increasingly warm for Scotland, hot for England and Wales this week. Southwesterly winds easing for much of Scotland but remnants of fronts bring further low cloud and drizzle to the west late this week. Locally a chance of thundery downpours in eastern Highlands later Friday, some of which may linger into Saturday but likely fading. A generally fine summertime outlook through the weekend and well into next week as high pressure expands northwards to broadly reside across Britain. Warm but generally pleasant summer temperatures next week. Sunshine and fair-weather cloud, many hills often clear. Easterly breezes for England and Wales.
