

Brecon Beacons

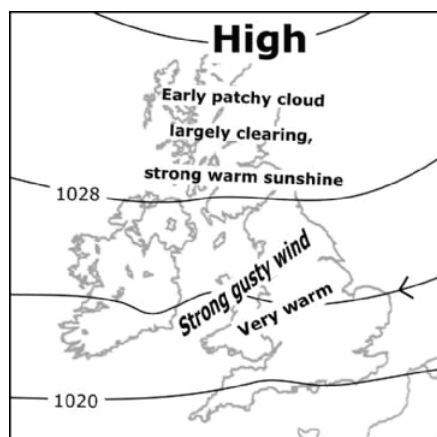
Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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General Summary for Monday, 13 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 July, 2026

Varied banks of cloud around hills in Scotland and Pennines early in the day, but increasingly dispersing during the morning to leave most or all hills clear. Strong sunshine, pleasant temperatures, warmest in western areas. Mostly light wind for the Highlands, gusty easterly further south. Very warm for Wales.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Strong gusty wind; very warm, sunny, hills clear.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 13 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 20-30mph; quite gusty in the morning over tops and downslope, reaching up to 35-40mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Comfort of walking affected on tops, more strenuous early with buffeting gusts starting to affect stability.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Likely none A few ribbons of cloud affecting some middle slopes of the Black Mountains, these very sparse and soon thinning and dissipating for clear hills.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine, some thin high cloud may drift in from the south. Good visibility, a light haze. High UV, beware sunburn, dehydration.
How Cold? (at 750m)	15C rising to 21 or 22C, (many valleys approaching 28C); less humid than recent days.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

	Tuesday 14 July	Wednesday 15 July
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Easterly 25mph, but some gusty spots 35mph around upper slopes, strongest speeds not necessarily on summits. Breezy over the hills, gusty areas making walking uncomfortable and affecting balance on ridges; feeling cooler.	Easterly 20 to 25mph, some gusty spots 35mph around some higher slopes and locally downslope to west in morning. Feeling breezy over the hills, gusty areas starting to affect comfortable walking and balance at times.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Rain unlikely Low risk of odd spots from high cloud, chance of an isolated shower mainly toward the southwest.
Cloud on the hills?	Early patches in east clearing Cloud banks over some eastern hills from dawn, mostly above 600m, dispersing early morning. Hills furthest west generally clear except for brief early fragments.	Little if any From dawn, some patchy cloud around 500-600m mainly eastern hills, soon all thinning and dispersing.
Chance of cloud free summits?	50% east early, lifting above 90%	Soon practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Early cloud in east, sunnier west, becoming more widely sunny. Some thin high cloud. Visibility becoming very good.	Strong sunshine most of the day, some thin high cloud. Visibility excellent, some early haze.
How Cold? (at 750m) Freezing Level	13 to 16C from dawn, coolest if in cloud, rising to 22C (valleys rising to 27 to 30C afternoon). Above the summits.	13 to 16C from dawn (coolest if in cloud), rising to 20C afternoon (valleys reaching 28C). Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 14 July, 2026

A fine week of summer weather - warm and dry with pleasantly warm temperatures and often plenty of sunshine. High pressure keeps the skies mostly clear, some low-level cloud rolling inland from the North Sea at times. A prevailing easterly flow, pushing the warmest temperatures for western hill groups, valley temperatures often 25C, or warmer for Wales and Peak District, at times 30C. A fairly sustained breeze most of the week in England and Wales, at times stronger and quite gusty. Notably dry ground conditions, beware very high fire risk. A cooling trend toward the weekend as north-northeasterly winds develop, a few showers possible, but a dry theme likely into early next week.
