

Brecon Beacons

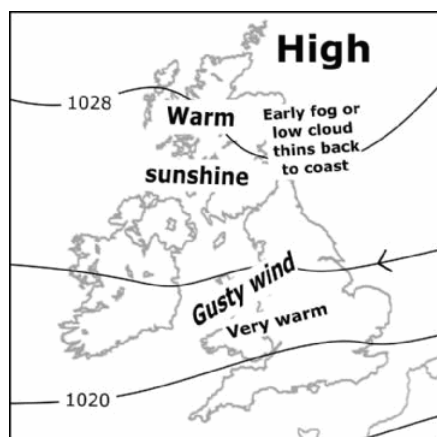
Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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General Summary for Tuesday, 14 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 14 July, 2026

Dry with strong sunshine, warmest in west.

Early fog and low cloud over eastern hills retreats toward the North Sea in the morning. Gusty easterlies mainly central Scotland southwards, strongest for Wales.

Extremely dry ground conditions - beware high risk of fire.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Strong gusty wind, warm sunshine, early patchy cloud east.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 14 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 25-30mph, but some gusty spots 35-40mph around upper slopes, strongest gusts not necessarily on summits; speeds lessen a little afternoon, but rise slightly again up to dusk.
Effect of wind on you?	Breezy over the hills, gusty areas making walking uncomfortable and affecting balance on ridges; feeling cooler where exposed.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Early patches in east clearing Cloud banks over some eastern hills from dawn, mostly above 600m, highest summits may be near top of the cloud; dispersing early morning. Hills furthest west generally clear except for brief early fragments.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60% east early, lifting above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Early cloud in east, sunnier west, becoming more widely sunny. Some thin high cloud. Visibility mostly very good. High UV, beware sunburn.
How Cold? (at 750m)	13 to 16C from dawn, coolest if in cloud, rising to 22C (valleys reach 28 to local 30C afternoon). Directly in the wind will feel fresher, but beware dehydration.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Easterly 20 to 25mph, some gusty spots 35mph around some higher slopes and locally downslope to west in morning. Feeling breezy over the hills, gusty areas starting to affect comfortable walking and balance at times.	Easterly 20mph, some gusty areas at times 30mph, not just on the highest terrain. Fairly small, but some more gustier locations may make walking uncomfortable through high passes and some slopes.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Soon clearing From dawn, some cloud banks around 500-600m mainly eastern hills, some high tops above this cloud, soon all thinning and dispersing.	Hills clear Any patchy cloud on eastern slopes at first soon dispersing.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Soon practically certain	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Strong sunshine most of the day, some thin high cloud. Visibility excellent, some early haze.	Sunshine over the hills dawn til dusk, occasional thin high cloud. Visibility excellent.
How Cold? (at 750m) Freezing Level	13 to 16C from dawn (coolest if in cloud), rising to 20C afternoon (valleys reaching 28C to local 30C south). Above the summits.	15C from dawn (warmer than valleys at first), rising to 20C (valleys reach 28C). Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 15 July, 2026

Staying broadly fine likely through the weekend into early next week at least - dry with pleasantly warm temperatures and often plenty of sunshine. Some coastal fog rolling inland overnight for misty dawns in places this week.

Valley temperatures rising to 25C or above, typically warmer in Wales and Peak District. Gusty easterly winds for England and Wales. An ongoing very high risk of fire with extremely dry ground conditions. Into the weekend, northerly breezes develop more widely, a cooling trend for a time, particularly Scotland where summit temperatures likely dip back below 10C; some cloud may be drawn onto northern mountains at times, small chance of isolated showers.
