

Brecon Beacons

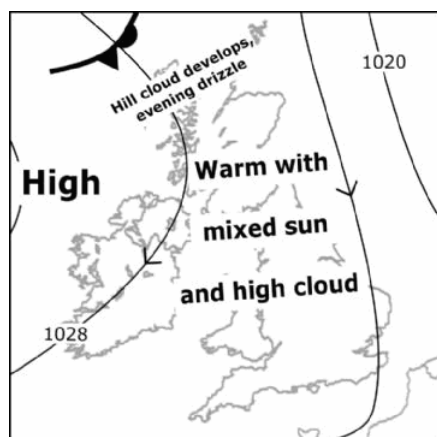
Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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General Summary for Sunday, 19 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 19 July, 2026

Some patchy mist here and there at dawn, but the hills largely clear with a mix of sun and high cloud across the country. Mostly warm, milder north Scotland where cloud patches graze highest tops. Late in the day, hill cloud arrives into northwest Scotland with light drizzly rain. Fire risk remains high.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Very warm, mix of sun and fair-weather cloud

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 19 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly 10mph or less much of the day, some light and variable periods, tending to strengthen into evening to 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear
Chance of cloud free summits?	Nearly certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Often sunny, some thin high cloud, fair weather cloud developing for a patchwork of sun afternoon. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m)	10C rising to 16 to 18C, warmest Black Mountains and southern slopes; coastal-facing Cambrians and Preseli hills stay a degree or two cooler.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Brecon Beacons - Looking Ahead

	Monday 20 July	Tuesday 21 July
How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly 5-15mph; both speed and direction variable.	North to northwesterly 5 to 15mph, increasing a little during day.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small.	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Largely dry Small chance of an isolated shower late in the day toward evening.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear	Generally clear Rare brief patches on higher slopes, mainly morning.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Nearly certain	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Often sunny, fair weather cloud building afternoon. Very good visibility.	Patchwork of cloud and sun, sunshine best near coast in afternoon. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 750m)	12C rising to 18 or 19C, warmest east; coastal Cambrians/Preseli hills stay a degree cooler.	13C rising to 17C afternoon Brecon Beacons, slightly cooler western tops.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 20 July, 2026

Weather remains settled through next week as high pressure persists west of Ireland. Northwesterly flow keep temperatures nearer to average for the time of year, dawn temperatures in the middle single digits in Scotland; staying warm in England and Wales but maximum summit temperatures only to the high teens. Cloud and drizzle starts to affect northwest Scotland more often, occasionally drifting further south, chance of an area of patchy rain slipping south through the country on Wednesday, though totals likely small. Despite this, ground remains very dry with high fire risk, with active wildfires limiting access in places. An unsettling trend is indicated next following weekend, bringing wind and rain first to Scotland and increasingly widely. England and Wales may remain quite warm.
