

Brecon Beacons

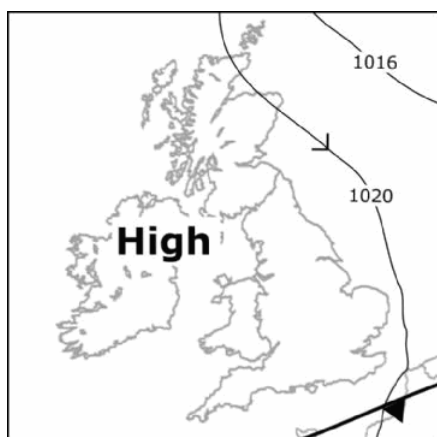
Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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General Summary for Monday, 10 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 August, 2026

Windy in northern and western Scotland, particularly morning. Elsewhere, the breeze dropping away. Periods of bright sunshine, particularly England and Wales - beware sunburn. Only occasional sunshine toward NW Scotland.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Wind dropping. Bright sunshine.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 10 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Northwest to northerly 10mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Low risk isolated shower at first Possibly isolated brief showers west Wales until mid morning. - then dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Very little, although probably taking a few hours to clear Cambrian range Cloud may come and go in morning on tops on Cambrian range, but will clear the summits by midday, perhaps much earlier.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain by end of morning
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive or unbroken - perhaps through areas of high level cloud. The Cambrian range possibly intermittently cloudy in morning. Excellent or superb visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m)	10C, rising to 17C or a little lower slopes nearest Cardigan Bay.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	More or less unbroken sunshine. Excellent or superb visibility - haze may develop east Wales.	Extensive sunshine. Good visibility although a haze.
How Cold? (at 750m)	14C rising to 23C, although a little less hot southwest Wales.	15 rising to 25C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 11 August, 2026**

Chance of bursts of rain, possibly locally thundery on Wednesday NW England northwards, with further occasional rain (and low cloud) later in the week, mainly across the W & NW Highlands.
The almost completely dry and warm weather will persist elsewhere. Underfoot conditions will remain exceptionally dry.
There may well be little change in the pattern into next week.
