

Brecon Beacons

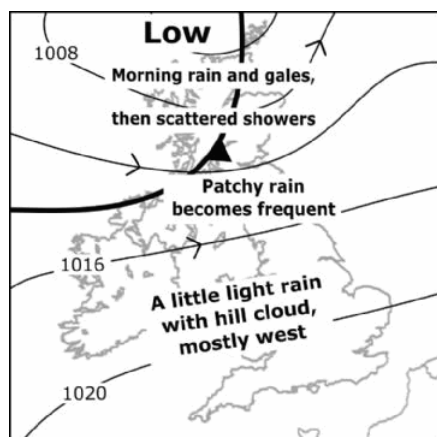
Includes all higher summits in the southern half of Wales: the Bannau Brycheiniog / Brecon Beacons National Park, southern Cambrian Mountains and highest Preseli hills.



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General Summary for Tuesday, 1 September, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 1 September, 2026

A swathe of rain and gales sweeps across the Scottish Highlands, moving over the Southern Uplands with time; bright sun breaks and scattered showers follow from the northwest. Patchy rain for western hills of England and Wales, sunny breaks east. Blustery with rain increasing later in north England.

Headline for Brecon Beacons

Occasional patchy rain; dry windows, cloud base lifting somewhat

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 1 September, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	West to southwesterly 15 to 20mph, occasionally rising to 25mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Damp at times Patchy drizzle and light rain comes and goes. Most rain will affect western hills, but a few clusters of light showers will spread east as well.
Cloud on the hills?	Varied, often shrouding high terrain Banks of cloud often cap higher slopes above 600 to 800m, lowest and most persistent in western areas. Some breaks toward upper slopes in east Wales, and perhaps some windows of breaks towards summits, but always a risk of bank returning across high terrain.
Chance of cloud free summits?	40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sunshine, some extended sunny windows but high cloud will thicken, some cloudier moments too. Visibility often good below cloud, but reduced if in rain.
How Cold? (at 750m)	10C rising to 12C, or less rise south and west slopes.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 2 September, 2026

The next week remains generally unsettled, and may well bring a deep low pressure systems with widespread gales and swathes of heavy rain. Beyond next week, indications of a more settled regime for a time.
