

General Summary for Sunday, 11 May, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 11 May, 2025

Showers develop inland western Scotland, heavy bursts or thunderstorms possible northwest later. Chance spots of rain south Scotland and north England, though mostly sunny. Modest winds here, some increase after dusk. Bursts of showery rain south Wales, chance localised thunderstorms later; some drift into north Wales.

Headline for Cairngorms NP and Monadhliath

High cloud gradually builds; low chance of rain

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 11 May, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	Southerly 15-25mph most of the day; strongest winds at dawn, up to 30mph over high tops. Winds ease in the west later afternoon to 10mph or less and becoming variable in direction.		
Effect of wind on you?	Some walking impeded in the morning, notably on exposed high terrain, becoming small.		
How wet?	Little rain expected		
(Precipitation and its impact)	Chance spots of light rain afternoon, most likely west Cairngorms and Monadhlaith. Increasing likelihood later in the day of odd heavy bursts.		
Cloud on the hills?	If any, only high tops in rain		
	Clear mountains most of the day. Small chance that cloud bases may lower onto higher tops in the afternoon/evening during bursts of rain.		
Chance of cloud free Munros?	Above 90%		
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny through morning. A patchwork of cloud builds through the day and may fill in quite extensively by later afternoon. Excellent visibility.		
How Cold? (at 900m)	8 or 9C, coolest temperatures west of the A9. Rising only slightly during the day; north Cairngorm plateau may rise more than other areas, up to 11C.

How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	9C, rising to 11C, up to 13C Monadhlaith. Deeside and east Cairngorms may see only minimal increase. Above the summits	At dawn, 8C south Cairngorms and Deeside, nearer 10C north. Rising several degrees for all, up to 14C north. Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 12 May, 2025

Lingering bursts of rain in Wales early next week will gradually fade as low pressure slips away. Only odd spots of rain in northwest England and west Scotland, soon fading. A continental wind track and high pressure to the east will keep most cloud above the summits next week, with eastern areas often sunny. Settled conditions prevail midweek into next weekend as high pressure reestablishes just north of the British Isles. A mix of cloud and sun with light winds, generally easterly though variable with little change day to day. Slight frosts at dawn in sheltered spots, mostly warm by day. Very dry ground conditions, beware high risk of fire.

Forecast issued at 16:23 on Saturday, 10 May, 2025
