

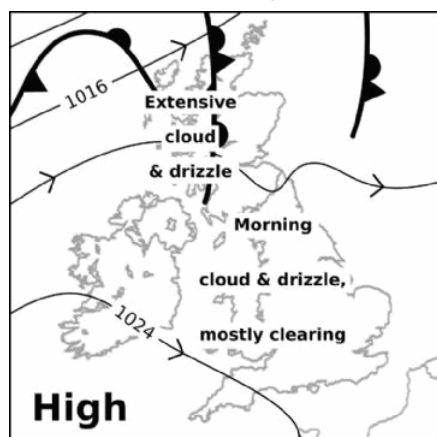
Cairngorms NP and Monadhliath

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General Summary for Wednesday, 9 July, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 9 July, 2025

Extensive cloud and drizzle near the all western coasts; improving in the afternoon when only a few patches remain, most extensive on the Cuillin where it will also be windy. Cloud base higher well inland with occasional breaks; clearing Peak District and parts of Wales. Feeling cool in Scotland and mild in England and Wales.

Locally extensive cloud; drizzle in the west

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 9 July, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	Westerly 20 to 25mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but feeling breezy on exposed higher areas.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Drizzly spots at times Occasional patches of drizzle mostly near and west of the A9.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Extensive west, breaks east Fairly extensive above 800-1000m western side of Cairngorms to Monadhliath and Ben Alder area. Higher cloud base eastwards, mostly above 1000m with breaks above 1200m at times. May temporarily clear for a few hours from mid-morning, best east of the main 20% west; 40% east
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, glimpses of sun mostly eastern areas. Visibility good below cloud, particularly in east.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	10C, rising to 13C toward east afternoon, humid. Feeling a touch cooler in the wind. Above the summits

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 10 July, 2025

A humid southwesterly wind midweek produces extensive low cloud across west and northwest Scotland with some drizzly rain. Drier with sun and broken cloud in eastern Scotland, improving in southern areas. High pressure expanding over England and Wales brings more sunshine and draws in increasingly very warm air again in the later part of this week; higher temperatures and more sunshine extending into Scotland with time. A fine and very warm weekend in prospect, low risk of thundery showers forming toward the west. Cooler with a greater risk of showers early next week.

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
