

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General Summary for Saturday, 20 December, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 20 December, 2025

South to south-easterly winds, reaching gale force for western hills, local drizzly showers southwestern Scotland as well as Wales, with rain into Pembrokeshire later. Elsewhere, areas of weak sun and low cloud. Low cloud focused on eastern side of Pennines and also southern and eastern Highlands.

Headline for Cairngorms NP and Monadhliath

Strong and gusty winds. Mostly dry. Hill fog focused in the south. Clearer in north.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 20 December, 2025

How windy? (On the Munros)	South to south-easterly 25 to 40mph, perhaps touching 50mph at times over Cairngorm Plateau.	
Effect of wind on you?	Walking fairly arduous for periods with a very gusty and turbulent airflow. Significant wind chill and buffeting.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No precipitation expected	
Cloud on the hills?	Breaks in north, covering hills in south.	
	Banks of low cloud covering the Drumochter hills and over to Ben Alder across upper slopes above 700m. Further north, caps of cloud mainly over tops with hill tops perhaps often clearing.	
Chance of cloud free Munros?	30% south, 70% north	
Sunshine?	Patches of weak sun through high cloud, mainly in the north.	
Air clarity (below cloud)	Visibility good or very good.	
How Cold? (at 900m)	2 or 3C, small rate of change in temperature with height. Directly in the wind feeling like -10 to -15C.	
Freezing Level	Around 1200m. Some fresh snow coverage over higher mountains.

How windy? (On the Munros)	South-easterly backing easterly 20 to 30mph, perhaps lifting to 40mph at times.	Southeasterly 35 to 45mph, easing to 20 to 30mph in afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Blustery, turbulent airflow with significant wind chill. Sudden gusts running downslope and reversals in direction.	Arduous conditions for several hours, sudden and strong wind gusts running downslope. Significant wind chill.
How wet?	Patchy rain and summit snow	Rain and drizzle becoming patchy
(Precipitation and its impact)	A few patches of rain or summit snow may feed in from the east or south-east at times. Small amounts and may well be dry for several hours.	A warm front and its widespread rain clears early, but further patches of rain and drizzle following, perhaps frequent onto hills accessible from Deeside.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive	Extensive, lowest bases in east.
	Hills very likely shrouded in cloud down to mid or upper slopes. Some breaks possible, between cloud layers.	Extensive low cloud will cover the hills throughout much of the day. Down to lowest slopes across eastern and southern areas.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	20%	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly overcast.	Overcast.
	Visibility good at times, but poor in any rain or snow.	Visibility poor in rain and drizzle, but improving to good as rain clears.
How Cold? (at 900m)	Around 1C, small change in temperature with height. Feeling closer to -10C in the wind.	3C, but feeling closer to -10C where exposed to the strongest winds.
Freezing Level	Around 1000m	Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 21 December, 2025

A much drier and chiller theme develops into the Christmas period and perhaps into the New Year, as high pressure builds to the north and northeast and maybe later in the period overhead over Scotland when inversion conditions would be in place. An extensive cloud sheet will likely come in from the North Sea over many days with light snow showers or flurries likely, rain to lower slopes, but many areas dry. Best breaks in the west.
