


Lake District

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General Summary for Saturday, 15 June, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 15 June, 2024

Frequent, at times heavy rain on English and Welsh mountains, especially those near the western coast. Persistent rain also in the far north. In the rest of Scotland often dry start, but widely wet in the afternoon through slow-moving showers. Light winds, milder than early June but still cool on tops.

Headline for Lake District

Overcast, frequent rain, at times heavy

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 15 June, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly, 10 to 20mph, sudden gusts near showers.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Frequent rain, at times heavy Rain from early morning hours, persistent and at times heavy. In the afternoon widely developing showers, possibly with hail and thunder. Around highest tops hardly any breaks in rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Covered by the coast, variable inland Low cloud on the highest tops, soon lifting, but lowering again in showers. Near the coast cloud base lower and also lower hills (500-600m high) covered.
Chance of cloud free summits?	40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Little to no sunshine. Mostly poor visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m)	6 to 8C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Lake District - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 16 June	Monday 17 June
How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly, 15 to 30mph.	Variable, 10-15mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small, balance starting to be affected on exposed ridges at times.	Negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Persistent, at times heavy rain High uncertainty, most likely persistent and at times heavy rain. Intense downpours possible, may lead to local flooding.	Rainy start, slowly improving Rain from overnight, possibly lasting longer during the day, heavy in places. Getting drier toward the evening from the west, but timing highly uncertain yet.
Cloud on the hills?	Tops covered extensively Tops above 700m covered all day long, lowest slopes partly clearing, but patches may return in heavy, persistent rain. Lowest cloud base near the coast.	Higher fells mostly covered Higher fells likely covered all day, those below around 600m possibly clearing around noon. Cloud lower in heavy precipitation, lowest cloud bases close to the coast.
Chance of cloud free summits?	10%	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Hardly any sunshine, at best few sunbeams toward the evening.	Mostly cloudy, improving from the west toward the evening, late afternoon a few sunny hours possible. Moderate visibility, poor in cloud, slightly reduced by haze if below clouds.
How Cold? (at 750m)	6 to 8C.	8 to 10C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 16 June, 2024**

Unsettled weather continues on Sunday and into next week, with cloudy skies, frequent rain showers and sometimes lightning or hail. Mild temperatures, but still not quite as warm as typically in June. Tuesday seems to be a good day for mountain activity in Wales, but still showery and cloudy in England and Scotland. High pressure building from the southwest on Wednesday should keep conditions good in Wales and improve them on English mountain ranges. The Highlands may see another front coming from the Atlantic, bringing again cooler air and rain.
