

General Summary for Wednesday, 3 July, 2024



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 3 July, 2024

Wet day for most in the mountains, with low cloud and often windy conditions. Particularly in Scotland murky and chilly winds, persistent rain in the west, on and off in the east Highlands. In England frequent rain spells, in Wales mostly showers on the western coastal hills, fading toward the evening.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 3 July, 2024

| How windy? (On the summits) | Southwest turning westerly, 20 to 30mph, stronger gusts, reaching or exceeding 40mph in the evening. |

| Effect of wind on you? | Strenuous walking conditions on higher fells, gusts affecting balance on ridges. Feeling chilly. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | Rain on and off Rain and drizzle on and off much of the day, most persistent west Lakes, some steadier rain in the morning. Smaller amounts eastwards. |
| Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud | Extensive Covering the fells widely, lowest and most persistent cloud toward the coast. A few breaks, bases tending to rise in the afternoon. 20% |

| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Overcast most of the day, improving late afternoon with a few breaks. Visibility poor at times due to rain, some improvements, mainly toward east. |
| How Cold? (at 750m) | 6 to 8C. Wind chill feeling sub-zero on tops. |

| How windy? (On the summits) | Westerly 25 to 35mph, strengthening during the day. Gusts around 50mph possible on higher peaks. | Southwesterly 15 to 25mph, gusts 35mph possible. |
| Effect of wind on you? | Arduous, walking becoming difficult. Buffeting leads to highly affected stability and significant wind chill factor. | Fairly small, but may be blustery on high exposed ridges and slightly affect balance. |
| How wet? | Rain possible, particularly west | Rain possible south |
| (Precipitation and its impact) | Localised, but slow-moving, possibly longer lasting rain, highest probability in western coastal fells from Black Combe through Scafell group to Ennerdale. May be heavy for a while. | Dry morning, low risk of rain moving in around midday rain onto the southern fells. Around Blencathra and Skiddaw very likely staying dry. |
| Cloud on the hills? | West mostly covered, east often clear | In the north often clear, south covered |
| | Higher peaks west of Borrowdale and those by the coast most of the day covered. Toward High Street cloud often above the hills in the first half of the day, but lowering in showers. | Northern fells often clear, south of Helvellyn tops above 700m often getting covered. Cloud coming and going on western coastal hills. |
| Chance of cloud free summits? | 20% west, 70% east | 70% north, 30% south |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Broken cloud allow for a few bright spells. | Sunny for a while in the morning on the northern fells. Becoming overcast, |
| | Reduced visibility through haze in the air. | afternoon hardly any sun. |

| How Cold? (at 750m) | 6-7C. Feeling below freezing point if exposed to wind. | 7-8C |

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 4 July, 2024

Cooling in the night to Thursday, with sleet falling on highest Scottish peaks. A trough arriving on Thursday to Scotland brings another wet day on the Highlands with upland gales. England and Wales, although very windy and gusty, should get some sun between common showers, perhaps excluding Lake District and North Pennines, where clouds and rain still dominate. Damp, but generally much drier on Friday, some rain still in West and Northwest Highlands, in Brecon Beacons, Snowdonia and Peak District. Uncertain development further on, most likely fairly cold for the season. Chance for fine conditions during the weekend but unstable air may cause locally heavy showers or thunderstorms.
