

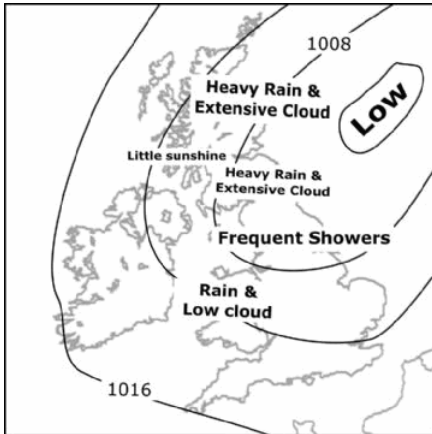
# Lake District

The entire Lake District National Park, taking in all major summits, including Scafell, Helvellyn, Skiddaw, the Langdales and Old Man of Coniston.



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## General Summary for Wednesday, 10 July, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 10 July, 2024

Rain widely in Highlands, particularly Cairngorms, where risk of local flooding - although very little rain in total near west coast and central belt. Showery bursts of rain southern Scotland southwards, although total rainfall in Wales (specially south and east) will be small. Hardly any sunshine and many higher areas foggy.

### Headline for Lake District

Mostly dull with areas of rain drifting slowly about

## Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 10 July, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Varied direction 10mph, possibly westerly 20mph south lakes late in day.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Mostly small.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Areas of showery rain drifting about slowly</b> Will vary from discrete showers to areas of showery rain, perhaps lasting a couple of hours.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive all day</b> Fog very extensive above 400 to 550m, sometimes forming from forest canopies up. However, particularly afternoon, some breaks to or locally above 650m.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Less than 10%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Rare glimpses of sun only. Often misty, although particularly later in day, visibility very good for periods.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	8C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northerly 10 to 20mph.	Mostly northerly, 10 to 20mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Small.</b>	<b>Mostly small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Locally showers</b> Isolated showers, just after dawn most likely toward Skiddaw, later by the coast. Likely dry afternoon.	<b>Mostly dry</b> Low risk for an odd shower by the coast and around High Street, but most likely dry.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Hills clearing early</b>  Hills often covered at dawn, mostly clearing early in the day.	<b>Hills mostly clear</b>  Cloud base largely above the hills, possibly lowering if showers occur.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>80%</b>	<b>80%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly overcast, chance for some brighter spells toward the coast.  Visibility becoming very good.	Patchwork of sun and clouds.  Excellent visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	5 to 7C	Around 9C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits	Above the summits

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 11 July, 2024**

Cool rest of the week. On Thursday light showers, particularly in northern England, southern Scotland and Wales, Highlands mostly dry. Generally improving toward the weekend, locally showers on Friday, wettest in northern Scotland. Low still circulating east of England may bring wet spells on eastern Highlands and Cheviots on both Friday and during the weekend, but western Highlands, Lake District and Pennines should stay mostly dry and get some sun. Again more widespread rain beginning of next week.
