

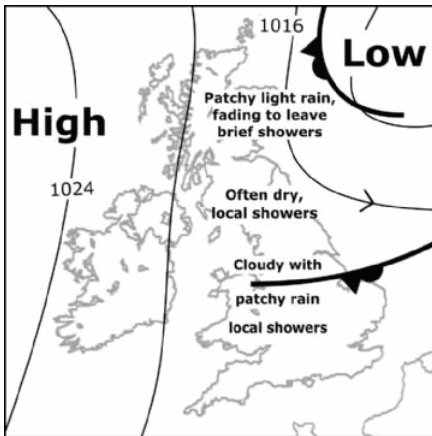
Lake District

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General Summary for Thursday, 11 July, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 11 July, 2024

Extensive cloud, more frequent rain in the morning on Snowdon range and in the Cairngorms. Sunny spells likeliest on the western Scottish coast. where cloud may lift during the day above most hills, leaving highest Munros in clouds. Windy on the eastern Highlands. Mostly cool temperatures.

Headline for Lake District

Patchwork of clouds and little sun with locally showers

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 11 July, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly 10 to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Locally showers morning Often dry, but a few showers possibly here and there. However, in any given place most of the day dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Covered morning, later partly clearing Extensive cloud above 650m from dawn, and in places patches on lower slopes. Will gradually improve as by early afternoon most cloud lifts above 900m.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20% rising to 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly cloudy only occasional sun. Visibility excellent.
How Cold? (at 750m)	5 to 7C
Freezing Level	Above the summits

Lake District - Looking Ahead

	Friday 12 July	Saturday 13 July
How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly, 10 to 20mph.	Northerly, mostly 20 to 25mph, gusting 30-35mph, on highest tops possibly 40mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small effect on walking, but feeling distinctly cool for July on higher summits.	Mostly small, on highest passes and exposed ridges may affect stability in gusts.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Mostly dry Low risk for an odd light shower toward the southwest Lakes, possibly also around High Street, but most likely dry.	Uncertain, risk showers Highly uncertain, showers possible all day, most likely toward the east, but also chance for longer dry periods.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills mostly clear Cloud base largely above the hills, brief patches possible on highest summits, mainly toward north and east.	Hills mostly clear Mostly clear, clouds may come and go on the highest peaks.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun and clouds. Excellent visibility.	Patchwork of sun and clouds. Very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m)	8C rising to 10C, locally 12C southwest Lakes in afternoon. In the breeze, at times feeling near-freezing highest tops.	Around 9C
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 12 July, 2024

Extensively dry over the next few days, although with one or two 'shallow' areas of low pressure close to Britain, rain is likely for a few hours in some areas - or sometimes afternoon heavy showers. Generally winds light; some sunshine, but overall fairly extensive cloud. A little less cold.
