

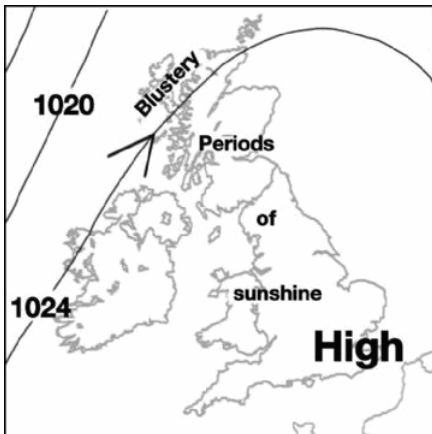
# Lake District

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## General Summary for Sunday, 28 July, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 28 July, 2024

Fine almost everywhere, although low cloud will take most the morning to clear summits in some areas. Periods of sun, although cloud will bubble up at times. Blustery coastal hills NW Highlands; otherwise fairly light wind, especially Pennines and east Wales.

### Headline for Lake District

Dry; periods of sun. Warm. Light wind.

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 28 July, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southerly, 10 to 15mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Mostly negligible.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	Rain very unlikely
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Very little indeed</b> Cloud will shroud some slopes, mainly south lakes morning, but the base will rise to clear the summits by late morning.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Greater than 90% by midday</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine, just patchy cloud. Excellent or perhaps in afternoon superb visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>	11C, rising away from fells nearest the coast to a warm 16C mid afternoon.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

**Lake District - Looking Ahead**

	<b>Monday 29 July</b>	<b>Tuesday 30 July</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Southerly 20mph. Perhaps sometimes 25mph westernmost fells. <b>Fairly small.</b>	Southerly 10mph.  <b>Negligible</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain very unlikely</b>	<b>Rain not expected</b>  Small risk fine drizzle here and there western fells and south lakes until mid or late morning.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>    <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Very little if any</b>    <b>90%</b>	<b>Summits all clearing</b>  Some uncertainty in extent of low cloud as a weakening front approaches overnight. It may be extensive for a few hours western fells and south lakes until midday.  <b>40% rising to 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine, although often weak (due to high level cloud). Excellent visibility.	Periods of sunshine though some areas (mainly south lakes) may be cloudy, particularly morning. Patches mist or haze clearing to give excellent, perhaps superb visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 750m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	11C near the coast, but in afternoon as high as a warm 15C eastern summits.  Above the summits.	10C, rising toward a warm 14 to 18C, warmest north lakes.  Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 29 July, 2024**

Extensively fine, very warm and light wind until mid week, although cloudy with a little rain NW Scotland on Monday. Remaining warm with mostly light wind later in the week, but bursts of sometimes thundery rain increasingly likely - at this stage uncertain as to the areas most affected.
