



General Summary for Friday, 20 September, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 20 September, 2024

Sunny, warm and calm with only morning valley fog in the Highlands. Low cloud southern Scotland and northeastern England, inversion, tops above the cloud. Sunny Lake District. East Wales under low cloud, west including Snowdon sunny & dry. Showers in Brecon Beacons. Locally gusty Welsh and English hills.

Sunny, dry & warm

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 20 September, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 15 to 20mph, on highest peaks in the east gusts 30-35mph possible.	
Effect of wind on you?	Small, but may be surprisingly gusty in the east to affect balance on high ridges.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected	
Cloud on the hills?	High tops clear, low cloud locally in valleys	
	The mountains cloud free all day. However, very low cloud or valley fog, top of which likely to be below 400m in the morning, particularly east of Windermere.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Bright sunshine and excellent visibility higher fells; sometimes foggy lower slopes, most likely east Cumbria.	
How Cold? (at 750m)	12 to 15C	
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	East to northeasterly, 15-25mph, gusts up to 40mph through elevated passes & locally downslope west of major ridges. Fairly small most places, but locally gusts may significantly affect your stability.	Northeast to southeasterly, mostly 5 to 15mph, but sudden gusts through elevated passes possible. Negligible mostly, but locally gusts may affect your stability.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Rain unlikely, north almost surely dry Low chance for showers in the southern Lakes.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear Morning fog in some valleys, especially around lakes and rivers. Most likely dispersing early.	Hills largely clear Locally morning mist, especially by lakes and rivers. Fells almost surely cloud-free.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain except for morning fog	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunny, very good visibility.	Very sunny and excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m)	12 to 14C	10 to 13C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 21 September, 2024

High pressure conditions with a lot of sunshine, warm temperatures and calm winds continue until early next week in Scotland and northern England. In Wales and Peak District during the weekend heavy showery bursts of rain, possibly thunderstorms. On Monday clouds and brief rain in Scotland. Northern England mostly dry, Peaks and Wales still wet. On Tuesday most likely dry day, before a deep low pressure system arrives on Wednesday/Thursday, bringing strong cooling and a lot of rain to most British mountains. Toward next weekend probably cold and wet, with again some snow on high tops.
