

# **Lake District**








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## General Summary for Sunday, 23 February, 2025



## **British Mountain Summary:**

## Based on forecast chart for noon 23 February, 2025

Severe conditions with storm-force winds widely over the mountains. Extensive heavy rain for Scotland in the morning, some wet snow only on highest summits for a time, by afternoon breaking up into showers. Heavy rain setting in for much of the day for England and Wales.

#### **Headline for Lake District**

Sustained storm-force winds. Soon heavy rain widely.

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 23 February, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	South to southwesterly 50 to 70mph, for periods over 80mph at least in gusts on higher tops.	
Effect of wind on you?	Severe conditions: mobility challenging across the fells, frequently knocking you off your feet where exposed higher up.	
How wet?	Rain increasingly heavy	
(Precipitation and its impact)	Rain arriving around dawn, soon heavy, continuing for several hours at least, staying wet much of the daytime, although during afternoon may become showery.  Very wet underfoot, streams increasingly in spate, some flooding later.	
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive	
	Shrouding the fells likely all day, from low-to-mid slopes upward south and western Lakes, mid-slopes northern areas. Highest of any breaks in Ullswater area.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	10%	
Sunshine?	Overcast and dull, sun unlikely.	
Air clarity (below cloud)	Hazy, poor visibility in precipitation.	
How Cold? (at 750m)	2C rising to 5C. Feeling like -10 to -15C due to wind chill.	
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

## **Lake District - Looking Ahead**

	Monday 24 February	Tuesday 25 February
How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 30 to 45mph, strongest in the morning.	Westerly 25 to 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Very blustery, often arduous over higher fells with frequent buffeting affecting balance. Significant wind chill.	Starting to affect comfortable walking and balance on exposed higher fells. Considerable wind chill.
How wet?	Occasional showers	Showers with snow on tops, hail
(Precipitation and its impact)	A little rain on and off over windward western fells, brief showers passing eastwards; may fall as snow on highest summits around 900m.	Showery precipitation, most frequent over western Lakeland, falling as snow above 600-700m, also occasional hail.
Cloud on the hills?	Most common on western tops	Varied over tops
	Banks of cloud typically base 700 to 900m, most frequent over western Lakeland; patches likely to come and go on high tops further eastwards.	Banks of cloud likely to come and go over higher tops, most frequent in western areas, bases 600-800m, briefly lower in showers.
Chance of cloud free summits?	50%	50%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun, mainly north Lakes. Visibility often good, reduced in showers.	Glimpses of sun, most frequent eastern Lakes. Visibility often very good, but reduced in showers, briefly very poor.
How Cold? (at 750m)	2C. Feeling like -7 to -10C in the wind.	0 or 1C. Wind chill feeling like -7 to -10C.
Freezing Level	Just above highest summits, then into night dropping to 800-900m.	800 to 900m.

## **Planning Outlook**

## All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 24 February, 2025

Returning to freezing over the Scottish Munros from Monday, staying sub-zero over the tops during the week ahead, whilst higher summits in England & Wales will fluctuate around freezing point. Beware of icy surfaces as previously thawed ground refreezes. Wet underfoot on lower ground with streams in spate and local flooding at first following several spells of heavy rain recently. Showery precipitation coming in from the west, falling as snow on the mountains, accumulating on higher terrain, also sometimes hail. A possibly more widespread area of rain and hill snow during midweek. Wind speeds varied, west to southwesterlies at times gale force on tops, prepare for considerable chill factor.

## Forecast issued at 16:00 on Saturday, 22 February, 2025
