








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General Summary for Saturday, 29 March, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 29 March, 2025

Deteriorating rapidly as a front, particularly active in western Scotland, brings precipitation and upland gales - or on Scottish highlands storm force winds. Heavy snow for a few hours mainly western Scotland, mostly rain elsewhere. Total rainfall small south toward S Pennines and Wales.

Headline for Lake District

Deteriorating quickly middle of day: upland wind near gale; rain and snow.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 29 March, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Increasingly windy after a morning lull - westerly around 20 or 25mph. Into afternoon southwest 35 to intermittently 45mph.	
Effect of wind on you?	Walking becoming arduous or difficult and wind chill significant.	
How wet?	o. out	
(Precipitation and its impact)	Substantially dry until midday or early afternoon. Then 2 to 4 hours of rain, sometimes heavy, sleet above 700m, snow briefly on higher tops, before turning to rain highest summits. Will by evening ease to a few showers.	
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive; lowest base afternoon	
	Cloud base typically 600 to 900m temporarily morning (lowest south Lakes). Will then lower further, particularly south lakes, to below 300 or 400m - but mostly above 550m north lakes.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	30% dropping to less than 10%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patches of sunshine, mainly east Lakes will soon give way as cloud thickens. Excellent visibility but very poor in rain or appalling in summit snow.	
How Cold? (at 750m)	0C rising to 2C. Will later feel as cold as minus 10C directly in the wind.	
Freezing Level	750m before lifting above the summits from west mid afternoon.

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Northwesterly slowly easing from 40 to on higher tops 50mph post dawn to 25 to 35mph evening, when will back westerly. Considerable buffeting and wind chill higher up, particularly morning, when balance difficult in places.	West or southwesterly 15 to perhaps 20mph or possibly 25mph highest tops. Fairly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain very unlikely	Little or probably no rain Chance pockets of fine drizzle morning south lakes.
Cloud on the hills?	Confined to higher tops: may clear nearly all summits afternoon By late morning cloud base typically 650 to 800m lowest western and central fells. Cloud base may lift to 800m or above afternoon. Toward dusk, initially near the coast may begin to form on lower slopes.	Summits gradually clearing, but timing uncertain Confidence low: Patches of, or extensive very low cloud, particularly south lakes morning. Higher slopes may be above the cloud. Through day will tend to mostly or perhaps all break up - timing uncertain.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%	30% rising to 70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sunshine; most sun lower slopes eastern fells. Slight haze, particularly western and central fells.	Sunshine coming through increasingly, but may be dull most of day south lakes. Very good or in afternoon excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m) Freezing Level	5C Rising slowly through the day. Will feel as cold as minus 8C directly in the wind. Above the summits	7C Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 30 March, 2025

Pressure will rise across the UK early next week, bringing extensively dry and for a few days very warm weather - albeit on Monday the remnants of fronts will bring a little rain but extensive low cloud to some western mountains. Later next week, some forecasts suggest a marked drop in temperature levels as the high pressure shifts position to the north of Scotland.
