

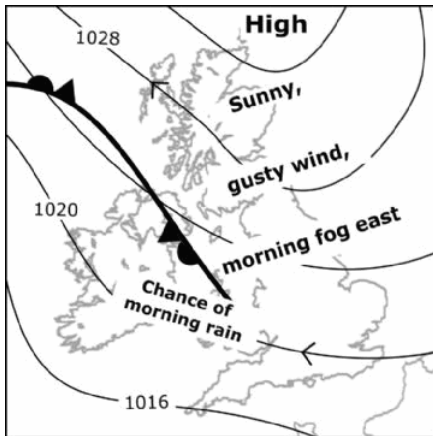
Lake District

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General Summary for Friday, 4 April, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 4 April, 2025

Gusty winds across all areas, strongest in southwest Scotland. Speed increasing around dusk England and Wales. Eastern Scotland and England seeing mid-slope cloud in the morning, some rolling over tops of the Pennines. Chance of morning rain south Wales and cloudy, clearing for a mostly sunny afternoon.

Headline for Lake District

Dry and sunny. Gusty winds and feeling chilly.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 4 April, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 25-35mph. Gusty over fell tops and through elevated passes, as well as around lower slopes for a time.
Effect of wind on you?	Walking becoming impeded, at times strenuous. Stability affected in buffeting gusts. Feeling chilly.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No precipitation expected
Cloud on the hills?	No cloud
Chance of cloud free summits?	Nearly certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Widely sunny. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m)	9C with little change through the day. Feeling near freezing in wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Easterly 20mph, gusts 30mph in places around higher tops and elevated passes. Feeling chilly in exposure, locally gusts may make walking uncomfortable, affecting balance on some ridges.	Southeasterly 20-25mph. Gusty through elevated passes and lower slopes. Slight easing through afternoon. Fairly small, some buffeting gusts momentarily impeding walking. Feeling chilly.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No precipitation expected	No precipitation expected
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Little or none Possible fragments of cloud drifting onto some eastern slopes in the morning. 90%	No cloud expected Above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny, thin patchy cloud. Visibility excellent.	Extensive sunshine. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m) Freezing Level	4C eastern slopes in morning, up to 6 or 7C western fells. Becoming 7C widely. Wind chill feeling just below freezing. Above the summits. Slight frost sheltered valleys at dawn.	5C rising to 7C. Feeling near freezing in direct wind. Above the summits. Slight frost sheltered valleys at dawn.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 5 April, 2025**

A high pressure center lingers over Britain next week. Extensively dry and sunny, possibly warm, some high cloud coming and going. Chilly mornings in valleys, slight frost and sometimes misty, though mists will soon clear for mostly cloud-free days. Occasional cloud banks may drift into eastern areas from the North Sea, staying on low to mid slopes. Generally light or calm winds across most areas. Later in the week, some indication of a westerly breeze into Scotland which will bring back cloud and some spots of drizzle.
