

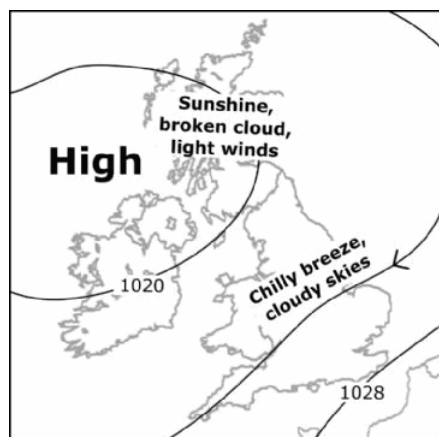

General Summary for Monday, 5 May, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 5 May, 2025

Fine with light winds for the Highlands, sunshine and the mountains largely free of cloud; starting chilly, warming up into afternoon. Chilly northeasterly winds England & Wales in the morning, easing gradually; fairly cloudy skies south & east Pennines, locally a shower.

Headline for Lake District

Chilly breeze in morning. Broken cloud and sun.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 5 May, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Northeasterly 15 to 20mph early morning, nearer 25mph at dawn, easing to 10mph or less into afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Breezy at first and feeling chilly where exposed on higher terrain all morning, becoming small into afternoon.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Cloud above hills
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Bright sunshine best in morning; cloud bubbling up afternoon. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 750m)	0C from dawn; rising to 7C afternoon. In the breeze feeling as cold as -6C at first, around +3C afternoon.
Freezing Level	Above the summits, but post dawn, frost some valleys.

Lake District - Looking Ahead

	Tuesday 6 May	Wednesday 7 May
How windy? (On the summits)	Direction varied 10mph or less.	Northeasterly 10mph, increasing later in day to 15-20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible	Small, but feeling increasingly chilly later as the breeze freshens.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain	No rain
Cloud on the hills?	Not expected	Not expected
Chance of cloud free summits?	Practically certain	Above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive or unbroken sunshine. Superb visibility.	Sun and high cloud, some patchy fair-weather cloud building afternoon inland. Visibility excellent.
How Cold? (at 750m)	4C at dawn; rising as high as 12C afternoon.	4C at dawn, rising to 11C by afternoon, though eastern fells may be a little cooler; later in the breeze feeling like 5C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits, but at dawn frost many upland and lowland valleys.	Generally above the summits, but at dawn near freezing with slight frost both in the valleys and on sheltered higher terrain.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 6 May, 2025**

High pressure continues to reside over the British Isles during the week ahead, maintaining generally dry conditions, low risk of an isolated afternoon shower. Winds mostly light, direction variable. Chilly nights with frost in valleys and sheltered higher terrain. Becoming pleasantly warm into the afternoons. Sunshine and variable cloud, at times covering the sky, but generally above the mountain tops with excellent visibility. Very dry ground conditions almost everywhere, beware high risk of fire.
