








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# General Summary for Monday, 26 May, 2025



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 26 May, 2025

Gales widespread over the mountains, during afternoon in Wales strengthening to become increasingly severe on tops. Showery bursts, most frequent in the west, hail and isolated thunder. Merging into constant and heavier rain for England, Wales and southwest Scotland later.

#### **Headline for Lake District**

Windy, gales high tops; heavy showers, wetter later.

## Detailed Forecast for Monday, 26 May, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 35 to 40mph, at times 45mph over higher fells. Toward evening, strengthening to 55mph.	
Effect of wind on you?	Frequent buffeting across the fells, making balance difficult on exposed ridges.  Deteriorating further late in the day to become difficult. Significant wind chill.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showery rain Showery throughout the day, initially focused toward western areas, but soon widespread, on and off all day, brief heavy bursts. Later in day developing into more persistent rain, setting in heavier, continuing into night.	
Cloud on the hills?  Chance of cloud	Varied over tops, mostly west; lowering  Frequently capping higher summits, especially western areas, above 800m, some patches to 600m in showers. Breaks higher up at times, clearing for longer toward and east of Helvellyn. More extensive later in constant rain.	
free summits?	30% west, 60% east; later 10%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Brief bursts of sun, mostly east in morning. Visibility very good at times, but suddenly poor in showers, generally reducing to poor later.	
How Cold? (at 750m)	3C rising to 5 or 6C. Wind chill feeling near -10C on high tops.	
Freezing Level	Above the summits	

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#### **Lake District - Looking Ahead**

	Tuesday 27 May	Wednesday 28 May
How windy? (On the summits)	West to southwesterly 25-30mph in morning, turning southerly 15-20mph. Risk SW'ly 40-50mph by evening.	Westerly 20 to 25mph, possibly over 30mph for a few hours from dawn.
Effect of wind on you?	Blustery on high tops in morning, but improving for a time. Possibly deteriorating later in day, risk of upland gales.	Starting to affect comfortable walking where exposed on higher fells. More blustery at first. Marked wind chill.
How wet?	Rain likely developing, heavy later	Isolated showers
(Precipitation and its impact)	One or two light showers coming in from the coast in morning, fading.  Some uncertainty of timing - but threat of rain developing from the southwest afternoon, setting in heavier with time.	Showery rain from overnight may continue around dawn, but likely clearing to leave just brief passing light showers. Into night, risk of heavy rain moving in from the west.
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly little, then lowering in rain	Patches lifting above tops
	Patches of cloud mostly higher western fells in the morning; many tops clear or clearing for a few hours. Later as rain develops, cloud lowering to blanket fells to increasingly low levels.	Patches capping some high tops in the morning, mostly above 800m. Lifting to clear the tops by middle of day.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%, later 10%	70% rising above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun giving way as high cloud builds, becoming overcast. Visibility very good in morning, but poor later as rain develops.	Broken cloud and sun; cloud filling in for periods, sunnier later near coasts. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 750m)	4C rising to 7C.	5C rising to 8C. Wind chill feeling sub-zero in morning, risk nearer -5C at first.

## **Planning Outlook**

### All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 27 May, 2025

Changeable conditions this week with low pressure and frontal systems passing west to east. West to southwesterly winds prevailing, speeds varied, but gale force for periods on the mountains. Spells of rain and showers, some periods of sustained heavier rain. Cloud often shrouding higher terrain. Better toward the east and northeast of Scotland. Generally rather cool for Scotland, near freezing on highest summits early in week, then a little milder, or warmer further south over England & Wales. Some improvements in conditions especially in southern areas as pressure builds at times, but mixed westerlies are likely to prevail into the start of June.

#### Forecast issued at 16:00 on Sunday, 25 May, 2025
