

General Summary for Monday, 16 June, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 16 June, 2025

A front draped over the Highlands brings low cloud and drizzly rain to western areas, heavier rain pushing northwards in the afternoon. Southwesterly winds will strengthen later in Scotland, becoming gales on higher mountains by evening. Dry with sunny spells and cloud clearing the tops in England & Wales.

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Headline for Lake District

Moderate breeze, but increasingly windy later. Early low cloud clearing.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 16 June, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	West soon southwesterly, 20-25mph. Strengthening toward evening, reaching 35-40mph through to dusk and into night with possible stronger gusts on higher tops.	
Effect of wind on you?	Breezy over higher fells, later increasingly affecting comfortable walking, becoming arduous higher areas up to sunset with marked wind chill.	
How wet?	Rain not expected	
(Precipitation and its impact)	Possibly a little fine misty drizzle in cloud near to coast in morning.	
Cloud on the hills?	Early areas of low cloud breaking up	
	Cloud banks above 500-600m in the morning, mostly south Lakes around to western fells near Pillar. Capping tops elsewhere for a time, but more broken. Tending to lift, thin and disperse, slowest nearest to the coast, where some patches may linger on SW tops.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	40% rising to 80%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Variable cloud in morning, misty toward coastal slopes, improving to a patchwork of cloud and sun, very good visibility.	
How Cold? (at 750m)	11C, rising slightly afternoon. Will feel only just above freezing point directly in the wind toward evening.	
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Lake District - Looking Ahead

	Tuesday 17 June	Wednesday 18 June
How windy? (On the summits)	West to southwesterly 20 to 25mph, up to 30-35mph for a time early in day.	Westerly 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Breezy, starting to affect comfortable walking on exposed on high tops, risk more strenuous in morning.	Fairly small
How wet?	Rain and light showers fading later	Rain not expected
(Precipitation and its impact)	Drizzly then a band of showery rain passing southeastwards early morning, fading to drizzly showers mostly on southwestern fells, becoming drier during afternoon into evening from north.	
Cloud on the hills?	Covering higher fells, lifting later	Possibly on western tops for a time
	Fairly extensive above 700-800m during rain, locally below 500-600m for a time western areas. Bases rising and cloud tending to break with time during afternoon, soonest north Lakes.	Patchy cloud banks drifting onto some higher slopes mostly in western Lakeland in the morning; lifting most likely above the summits.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30% later 80%	70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Cloudy morning into early afternoon, then patchwork of sun coming through. Hazy or misty in places, then visibility becoming very good.	Glimpses of sun, best in east Lakes. Visibility very good below cloud.
How Cold? (at 750m)	10C.	8C rising to 11C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 17 June, 2025

Humid southwesterly winds early this week brings low cloud and spells of drizzly rain to western hills. High pressure to the south will tend to expand northwards during midweek, with dry conditions and warm air for all regions, sunshine and fair-weather cloud. Winds becoming light south to southeasterlies later in the week. Uncertainty by next weekend into early the following week, a risk of some rain or showers returning as pressure tends to fall.
