

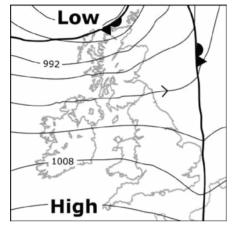

## General Summary for Sunday, 2 November, 2025



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 2 November, 2025

Showery westerly winds, reaching gale force Scottish Highlands where cold enough for snow on higher tops. The rain will be almost constant NW Highlands, whilst from southern Scotland southward, showers will become well scattered. Least windy south Wales.

#### **Headline for Lake District**

Wind near gale higher slopes. Showers. Cold.

# Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 2 November, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	West to southwesterly 30mph; generally least windy post dawn.		
Effect of wind on you?	Strenuous walking - stability sometimes difficult where exposed on higher summits.  Considerable wind chill.		
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showers, mainly morning Showers, perhaps frequent on some fells for an hour or two morning. Frequently dry by afternoon.		
Cloud on the hills?	Frequently covering higher tops		
	Cloud widely covering the fells after dawn. Cloud base will rise through morning to around 750m, but temporarily lower near showers.		
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%		
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sunshine, mainly eastern fells. Hazy		
How Cold? (at 750m)	3C. Will feel as cold as minus 10C directly in the wind.		
Freezing Level	Above the summits

#### **Lake District - Looking Ahead**

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 45-50mph.	South to higher up southwesterly 40 to 50mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Difficult walking and significant wind chill where exposed on higher tops.	Continued difficult conditions where exposed on higher areas, where wind chill will be significant and walking a struggle.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Frequent rain, particularly south lakes	Frequent or persistent rain.
	Frequent or almost incessant rain, often heavy; a risk of flooding with rivers in spate. Generally least wet north lakes.	Rain most or all day. Breaks in the rain most likely north lakes. Very wet underfoot and streams in spate - possible flooding.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive	Very extensive.
	Most fells persistently shrouded down to lower slopes, Higher cloud bases near Haweswater and Ullswater but unlikely to lift above 600-700m.	Widely persistent fog above 200 to 400m. Toward north and northeastern fells, higher cloud base, may reach 650m.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost nil	10%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Dull and misty or foggy.	Little if any sun: mostly dull and misty.
How Cold? (at 750m)	9 or 10C. Minimal change with added height. Feeling below freezing in exposure to wind.	8C Will feel as cold as minus 2C directly in the wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits.

# **Planning Outlook**

### All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 3 November, 2025

A series of deep Atlantic lows and associated fronts will continue to cross Britain over the next week to ten days. Frequently windy, and high rainfall, particularly on western mountains (rain at some stage almost daily) and cloud will frequently cover higher areas. Only rarely cold enough for snow higher mountains in Scotland.
