
The Northwest Highlands

Areas north from Knoydart in the west, and the Great Glen towards the east (NB. Does not include Mull and areas west of Loch Linnhe, these are found in the West Highlands forecast.)



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General Summary for Wednesday, 16 October, 2024



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 16 October, 2024

Gale force southerly winds, very gusty over the mountains, lessening from the west. Generally wet with low cloud across all regions, but northwestern Scotland seeing smallest amounts of rain, locally dry for periods. Some heavier periods of rain extending northwards over England, Wales & southern Scotland.

Headline for The Northwest Highlands

Upland gales easing. Patchy rain, low cloud, drier northwest.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 16 October, 2024

How windy? (On the Munros)	South to southeasterly; tending to ease through day, from 35 to 55mph after dawn into morning, toward 25 to 35mph into afternoon, least wind toward dusk. Very gusty, particularly downslope north of major summits.
Effect of wind on you?	Considerable buffeting and wind chill where exposed in the morning. Sudden powerful gusts, sometimes on lower slopes may blow you over. Improving with time.
How wet?	Rain on and off, mostly morning
(Precipitation and its impact)	Pulses of rain throughout day - some steady rain fairly widely early morning, easing off. Then north from about Torridon, often little more than 'spots in the wind', and overall amounting to little.
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly confined to higher tops
	Skye and south from Knoydart: persistent cloud above 600 to 800m, perhaps base dropping toward 300m at times, particularly Skye. Elsewhere, varied cloud base, patches above 750m, but often confined to higher tops.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Rare sunshine coming through, mainly north of Torridon. Mostly good visibility, although a haze.
How Cold? (at 900m)	8 to 12C, coldest where in cloud. Will feel below freezing point directly in the wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

The Northwest Highlands - Looking Ahead

South to couthwasterly 45 to 05 mm	
South to southwesterly, 15 to 25mph, typically strongest on mountains near west coast, local 30mph at times.	Southwesterly, starting 40mph and deteriorating, becoming 50-60mph on tops.
Fairly small, but may start to affect balance at times on exposed higher ridges.	Difficult conditions, becoming severe, walking hardly possible on exposed paths. High wind chill factor.
A little rain, fading	Dry start, persistent rain afternoon
Patchy rain from before dawn tending to break up and clear northeastwards during the morning. Pockets of drizzly rain may linger on/near Skye, locally a brief light shower, but much of region often dry.	Likely dry morning, perhaps damp with a local shower on and around Skye. More widespread rain moving in from the southwest around noon, becoming persistent. Increasingly heavy toward the evening, especially Skye and Kintail.
Varied, most persistent Skye	Progressively more extensive
Varied banks of low cloud, plus fog in some glens from dawn. In many areas, will lift toward higher slopes, clearing some tops toward east. But on/nearest Skye, very low cloud may cloak the hills all day.	Firstly in the far north and in the east hills often clear, toward Cuillin covered from start. Cloud rapidly descending to cover hills down to to lower slopes.
10% Skye, rising to 60% Ben Wyvis area	30%
Glimpses of sun west, but more often sunny toward east and northeast. Around Skye may remain misty, but elsewhere out of cloud visibility very good.	Some sun toward the east and north in the morning, dull along western coastal hills. Often poor visibility.
6 to 8C, coolest in cloud in west.	6 to 9C, warmest in the far north. Wind chill feeling well below freezing.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 17 October, 2024

South to southwesterly winds will prevail over the next week or more, bringing mild or very mild temperatures, but an unsettled outlook with periods of rain, heavy at times. Temperatures will stay above freezing to higher tops, so recent snow cover will all thaw. Generally least rain toward north-northwest Scotland (north of about Torridon). Thursday is drier for many places. Rain on and off onward into the weekend. Frequently windy on the hills - Friday and then Sunday likely to be the windiest days during the week ahead - reaching storm-force winds on higher mountains. Next week, higher pressure may expand over England and Wales at least for periods.
