

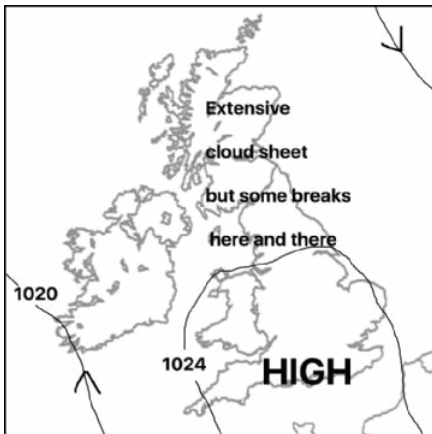
Peak District

General Summary for Sunday, 18 October, 2020



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 18 October, 2020

Little wind across the hills for much of the day with extensive cloud sheet covering many higher slopes across the Highlands, but mainly above tops elsewhere. Here and there breaks in the cloud sheet giving sunshine. Mostly dry, but risk of a few showers; particularly W Scotland.

Headline for Peak District

Little wind. Extensive cloud sheet, but hills clear below this. Risk showers.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 18 October, 2020

How windy? (On the summits)	Very little wind at all post dawn. Will become southwesterly strengthening toward 15mph by dusk.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk of showers Extensively dry, although threat of scattered showers by afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Summits extensively cloud free
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Generally cloudy, although pockets of sunshine coming through here and there, locally for an hour or so. Excellent visibility.
Temperature (at 600m)	5C
And in the valleys	Will rise to around 11C in the afternoon.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Monday 19 October	Tuesday 20 October
How windy? (On the summits)	South to southwesterly; 25 to 30mph.	Low confidence in detail: South to southwesterly 20 to 40mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Likely to impede ease of walking on higher areas.	Likely fairly arduous at times across the hills with significant wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain may start later in day Rain out over the Irish Sea may begin to reach Peak District in afternoon - although most likely very little until after dark.	Often dry, a few showers. Often dry through the day, but now and again a showery burst of rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Summits extensively cloud free Typical cloud base 650-800m. Patches will occasionally cover higher tops after dawn, and again in rain.	Mostly very little Hills often clear through the day. Just occasional patches across high tops for a time in and around showers.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine occasionally, most likely eastern dales. Very good or excellent visibility, although will drop in rain.	Occasional patches of sun. Visibility good or very good.
Temperature (at 600m)	6C	10C
And in the valleys	12C.	14 to 16C

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 19 October, 2020**

Low pressure will envelop Britain on Monday, heralding a change to intermittently windy weather and frequent periods of rain; particularly across Scotland where large accumulations will build up across the Southern Uplands and southern and western Highlands with conditions becoming very wet underfoot. Chiller again from Wednesday or Thursday with rain then falling as snow across the Munros.
