


Peak District

General Summary for Monday, 10 May, 2021



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 May, 2021

Many areas dry from dawn, but patches of rain affecting some western hills, mainly near coast. Showers will develop more widely from mid morning with some torrential downpours forming in the afternoon with the risk of hail and thunder. Banks of hill fog in and around showers. Risk gales highest tops in Wales.

Headline for Peak District

Blustery day with showers developing. Risk hail and thunder into afternoon.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 10 May, 2021

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 20 to 25mph, sometimes 30mph Kinder & Bleaklow plateau.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly blustery on higher tops and exposed edges; expect sudden gusts during or prior to heavy showers.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Local downpours; hail, risk lightning Hit and miss bursts of rain, developing increasingly through the day, may locally result in rain for an hour or more, but some places missing most of the rain. Risk of hail and thunder.
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly above hills Most cloud often above the hills. Patches on some slopes in the morning will lift and break. Then banks of cloud lowering during and after rain, with patches briefly to some lower slopes.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun, but cloud filling in for periods. Visibility often very good, but suddenly very poor in rain.
Temperature (at 600m)	5C rising to 8C
And in the valleys	7C at dawn, rising to 14 to 16C afternoon.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Tuesday 11 May	Wednesday 12 May
How windy? (On the summits)	South to southeasterly 15 to 25mph; strongest both early and late in the day.	South to southeasterly 10-20mph; perhaps less at times.
Effect of wind on you?	May impede walking at times across tops with local buffeting.	Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showers developing widely, risk thunder. Mostly dry at first, but showers soon developing from mid morning. These becoming widespread into the afternoon with the risk of hail and thunder.	Showers developing; risk hail and thunder. Mostly dry start to the day, but showers will develop from mid morning and some will become heavy into the afternoon with the risk of hail and thunder.
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly above hills. For much of the day, the hills will be clear. However, in and around showers, some patches of cloud may form across tops.	Mostly above the hills. Hills mostly clear through the day, but in and around showers, some patches may form across higher tops.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%	70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun, perhaps extensive at first. Visibility very good, but lowering in showers.	Occasional sunshine. Visibility very good, but occasionally poor in showers.
Temperature (at 600m)	4C lifting to 8C	4C lifting to 8C
And in the valleys	Lifting to 14 to 16C into the afternoon.	Lifting to 15 or 16C into the afternoon.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 11 May, 2021**

Low pressure situated to the west of Britain brings unsettled and showery conditions next week, some heavy downpours with hail and thunder. Varied winds. Generally milder than recently; only close to freezing point on highest Scottish summits, a thaw of lying snow, becoming confined to patches on high tops. Northernmost mountains may drop colder after midweek if a northeasterly wind strengthens. Toward next weekend, high pressure building toward the north is likely to bring drier conditions for a time to west & northern Scotland; uncertainty about extent of improvement elsewhere.
