

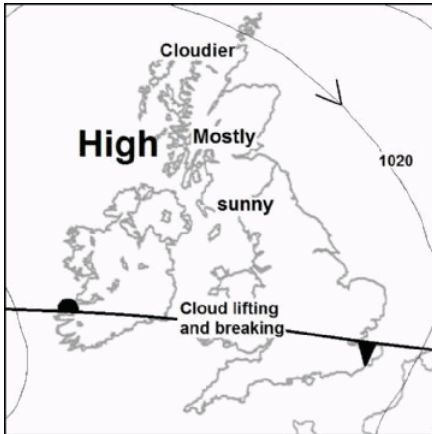
Peak District

General Summary for Friday, 15 October, 2021



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 15 October, 2021

A crisp autumn day with plenty of sunshine and light winds for many places. Frost at dawn, particularly Highland glens. Highest Scottish summits staying near or just below freezing all day. Remnants of a front brings mostly cloudy skies to mid & south Wales.

Headline for Peak District

Dry with sunshine, chilly.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 15 October, 2021

| How windy? (On the summits) | Northeasterly 15 to 20mph around dawn, easing through morning to become variable 5-10mph. |
| Effect of wind on you? | Blustery start with marked wind chill, conditions easing into afternoon. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | No rain |
| Cloud on the hills? | Very little or none Any early patches around dawn will soon clear to leave hills clear. |
| Chance of cloud free summits? | Above 90% |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Some high cloud from dawn will break up to leave mainly sunny skies, then a little cloud building up through the day. Visibility excellent. |
| Temperature (at 600m) | 4 to 6C, coldest at dawn. Will feel sub-zero where exposed on high tops early morning. |
| And in the valleys | 7C at dawn, only rising to 10 to 12C. |

Peak District - Looking Ahead

| How windy? (On the summits) | West to southwesterly, 15 to 20mph. | Southwesterly 15 to 25mph. |
| Effect of wind on you? | Fairly small, but sometimes blustery where exposed on high tops. | Buffeting on exposed tops and near edges, feeling cool on higher terrain. |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | Most likely dry Chance of a little fine drizzle if around low cloud for a time. | Drizzly rain mainly west and north Some uncertainty: Risk of drizzly rain for several hours at least on western side of Peak District and Lancashire Pennines. Further south and east amounting to very little. |
| Cloud on the hills? | Early fog mostly clearing Areas of low level fog from dawn, many hill tops probably above this, although some elevated cloud banks may exist. Will mostly thin and break up, slowest in southwestern areas. | Low cloud Lancs & northern Peak Cloud likely to shroud many higher hills in the morning. May persist above 500-600m north from about Bleaklow, or lower in rain on hills to the north of Manchester. |
| Chance of cloud free summits? | 80% | 40% |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Fog will thin to give some sunshine, although fairly cloudy skies may persist. Visibility becoming generally good, distant haze. | Fairly cloudy overall, dull western side of Pennines. Occasional brighter or sunny intervals on eastern moors, visibility good. |
| Temperature (at 600m) | 6C rising to 9C by afternoon. | 8 to 10C |
| And in the valleys | 5C around dawn, perhaps slight frost some valleys. Max 13 or 14C by afternoon. | 8C at dawn, 12 to 14C by afternoon. |

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 16 October, 2021**

A chilly start to the weekend, but milder air returns from the southwest to all regions by Sunday. Some rain, although a fair amount of dry weather too this weekend. An unsettled week ahead as low pressure moves in from the Atlantic accompanied by a series of frontal systems. Often windy, periods of gales or severe gales on the mountains. Rain heaviest and most persistent in western areas. Mild southwesterlies early in the week, then colder air returns from the northwest later in the week - temperatures falling below freezing on high tops with showers of snow. Changeable conditions are expected to continue into late October.
