


# Peak District

## General Summary for Friday, 26 November, 2021



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 26 November, 2021

A severe storm moves into Scotland from the north. Mountain gales strengthening to hurricane-force afternoon into evening. Snow setting in heavier in the north, falling to increasingly lower levels and spreading further south later. Frequent heavy showers for Wales with hail, risk thunder. Drier S Scotland & N England with some sun.

### Headline for Peak District

Windy, often gales on higher tops. Showery periods, hail.

## Detailed Forecast for Friday, 26 November, 2021

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	West or northwesterly, 30 to 45mph. Sudden strong gusts, particularly near precipitation. 60-70mph into night.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Significant wind chill and difficult walking conditions, including sudden gusts - these reaching lower slopes.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Showers, increasingly of snow</b> A mix of showery periods, and most likely morning an hour or so when precipitation almost constant - progressively turning to snow, later above 500m. Hail and risk thunder in morning. Then into night, risk areas of snow spreading from the north, falling to lower elevations.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Hills intermittently cloud free</b> Will vary, sometimes quickly. Cloud extensively above 500m but nearer 300m more western slopes at first, but by midday will extensively clear.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>50%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Glimpses of sun. Visibility changing quickly, sometimes good, but abruptly very poor in snow.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	3C dropping to 1C. Wind chill -10C on highest tops.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	6 to 8C, but sudden drop in temperature near showers. Dropping rapidly toward 0C later into the evening.

	<b>Saturday 27 November</b>	<b>Sunday 28 November</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northerly 40 to 50mph.	Northerly 25 to 35mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Difficult conditions with severe wind chill on higher terrain. Considerable buffeting even on lower hills.</b>	<b>Significant wind chill. Considerable buffeting where exposed on higher terrain.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Snow showers</b> Snow showers or flurries from time to time, risk frequent for a few hours in the morning, when snow may fall and lie into some valleys for a time.	<b>Precipitation unlikely</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Tending to lift</b>  Risk of fairly extensive cloud on the hills early morning. Toward middle of day onward, occasionally cloud below 500m but often cloud base near or above higher tops.	<b>Little if any</b>
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>40% rising to 80%</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patches of sunshine. Visibility very good.	Mostly sunny. Superb visibility.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	-2C. Wind chill as cold as -15C.	-2C. Wind chill as cold as -13C.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	Near to freezing early morning, rising gradually only toward 3 or 4C by early afternoon.	Near freezing from dawn into morning, only rising to 3 or 4C into afternoon.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 27 November, 2021**

Very cold this weekend with northerly gales or storm-force winds. Severe wind chill conditions on higher mountains on Saturday. Easing gradually from the west into Sunday. Snow showers focused on north-facing mountains, sometimes frequent or merging to constant falls for a few hours. Areas of sunshine and clear air away from showers.

Next week, west to northwesterly winds prevail. Precipitation frequent, with further bouts of upland gales or severe gales. Temperature will vary, lifting above freezing to highest summits early in the week. Colder again by midweek, then cycles of freeze & thaw are likely into next weekend, although mountains in England & Wales only temporarily sub-zero.
