

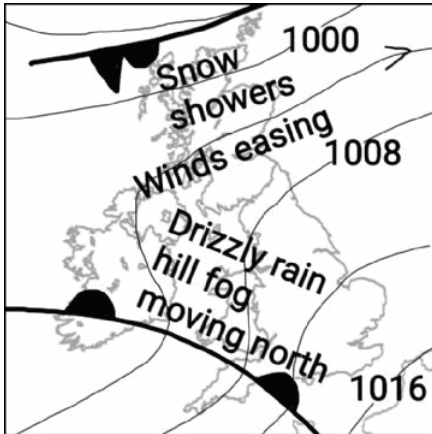
Peak District

General Summary for Tuesday, 13 February, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 February, 2024

Scotland; Southwesterly gales continuing to drive in showers, these of snow above 600-800m. Showers will ease, along with the wind, from the south in the afternoon.

England and Wales: Varied cloud and some drizzle at first, giving way from southwest to persistent rain and widespread hill fog.

Headline for Peak District

Bright start, but drizzly rain and hill fog will move in during the afternoon.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 13 February, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	South to southwesterly 15 to 25mph. Possibly increasing during daytime, risk of 40mph later into evening.
Effect of wind on you?	Likely fairly small for several hours at least, but noticeable wind chill on exposed tops. Beware deteriorating later.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Drizzly rain developing A few drizzly showers moving in from the southwest in morning, becoming persistent drizzly rain in the afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Varied, may become extensive Varied banks of low cloud at first, mainly western areas. Lowering widely towards and into the afternoon as rain spreads in and becomes persistent.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60% at first, lowering to 20% into afternoon.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	A little sun, may give way to thickening cloud. Visibility good, becoming murkier if rain develops.
Temperature (at 600m)	+2 or 3C, may rise further later. Wind chill feeling like -3C, or colder if speeds increase.
And in the valleys	Near freezing some dales at first, rising to 6 to 8C.

<p>Cloud on the hills?</p> <p>Chance of cloud free summits?</p>	<p>Likely extensive</p> <p>Blanket low cloud likely across the hills, lowest toward the south and west.</p> <p>20%</p>	<p>Fairly extensive</p> <p>Fairly extensive cloud layers through the day will cover the hills from mid to upper slopes.</p> <p>30%</p>
<p>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Overcast. Likely dull and misty.</p>	<p>Mostly cloudy.</p> <p>Visibility often poor due to rain and drizzle.</p>
<p>Temperature (at 600m)</p> <p>And in the valleys</p>	<p>6 to 8C. Feeling closer to freezing if exposed to wind.</p> <p>8 to 11C.</p>	<p>Lifting to 8C</p> <p>10 to 12C in the valleys.</p>

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 14 February, 2024

A mixed week ahead as areas of low pressure rotate in from the southwest bringing spells of rain of hill snow and sometimes showers. Least precipitation typically for the Cairngorms. Higher pressure to the north of Scotland by midweek may then become more extensive for a time by next weekend, allowing some drier conditions. Wind speed and direction very variable, often west or southwesterly, but easterly for time during midweek for Scotland; lulls mixed with spells up to gale force on higher areas. Scottish mountains generally staying sub-zero, maintaining snow coverage widely here during the week ahead. High tops in England & Wales lifting above freezing point by midweek for a time.
