

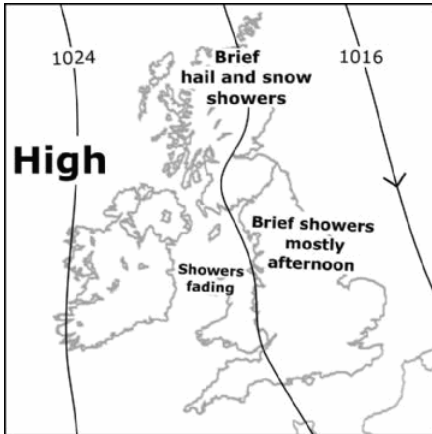
# Peak District

## General Summary for Tuesday, 11 June, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 11 June, 2024

Staying chilly across the mountains, but a gradual lift of temperature above freezing toward highest tops. Northerly winds fairly light but still a distinct chill in the air. A scattering of brief showers with hail, but a lot of dry weather with very clear air and cloud clearing most tops.

### Headline for Peak District

Chilly breeze. Scattered brief showers forming.

## Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 11 June, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northwest or northerly 15mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Small; although in the low temperatures will feel particularly cold in the wind.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Hail showers, mainly afternoon</b> Showers forming into afternoon, risk locally briefly heavy with hail.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Very little if any</b>
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Bright sunshine morning before cloud more or less fills in. Excellent or superb visibility.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	5C post dawn; rising to around 9C by mid-afternoon. Wind chill feeling sub-zero early morning, around 4C in afternoon.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	Risk slight frost some upland valleys at dawn; will reach around 15C in the afternoon.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Wednesday 12 June	Thursday 13 June
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Westerly 10 to 15mph or less.  <b>Small</b>	Southwest turning southerly, 20 to 30mph, strengthening during the day, risk later 40mph higher terrain.  <b>Increasingly blustery over the hills, walking becoming strenuous on exposed higher moors.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Little or no precipitation</b> Chance of an isolated brief shower.	<b>Rain moving in afternoon</b> Dry start, possibly well into afternoon, but an increasing risk of rain arriving from the west, becoming persistent, heaviest in western areas.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>     <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Very little if any</b>     <b>90%</b>	<b>Mostly little, lowering in rain</b>  Patches of cloud locally in the morning, but the hills largely cloud free until well into the afternoon. Later as rain moves in, cloud base lowering across the hills.  <b>80% dropping to 30% later in rain</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Cloud gradually filling in. Superb visibility.	Glimpses of weak sun giving way to overcast skies from west. Good visibility reducing to be poor in rain.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>  <b>And in the valleys</b>	6C rising to 10C.  Ground frost some valleys at dawn. By early afternoon, typically 15C.	6 to 9C. Feeling sub-zero as wind speeds increase.  5C or locally colder at dawn. Rising to 15C.

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 12 June, 2024**

Cold conditions will ease through midweek and winds will drop lighter. Low pressure approaching from the southwest by Thursday will see winds switch south to southeasterly and strengthen to gale force over west coastal mountains. Rain will move in from the west, becoming heavy. An unsettled outlook into the weekend and early next week as low pressure circulates slowly over the British Isles, bringing areas of rain and thundery showers. Wind speed and direction will vary, at times strong easterlies northern Scotland, west to southwesterly for Wales and Pennines. Temperatures will be higher, above freezing to tops, but not especially warm.
