

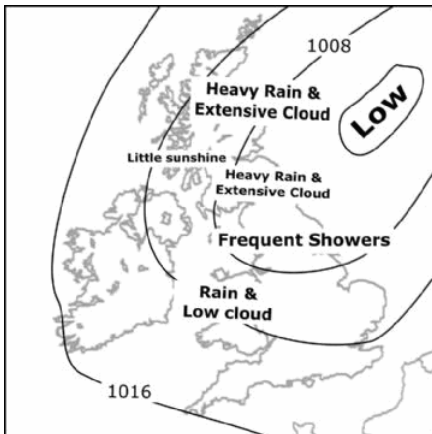
Peak District

General Summary for Wednesday, 10 July, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 July, 2024

Rain widely in Highlands, particularly Cairngorms, where risk of local flooding - although very little rain in total near west coast and central belt. Showery bursts of rain southern Scotland southwards, although total rainfall in Wales (specially south and east) will be small. Hardly any sunshine and many higher areas foggy.

Headline for Peak District

Light showers, wet underfoot, little to no sun

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 10 July, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	West to southwest, some uncertainty of highest speeds, 20 to locally 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Expect blustery conditions over some hills, affecting comfortable walking and feeling cool on exposed terrain.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showers Drizzly at times morning; improving to just a few showers in the afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Gradually lifting above most or all summits Cloud over higher moors for several hours in the morning will gradually clear to or above 500m, perhaps clearing the highest areas
Chance of cloud free summits?	20% rising to 60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun only. Visibility very good.
Temperature (at 600m) And in the valleys	 12C at dawn, rising to 18C.

How windy? (On the summits)	Northeasterly 10 to 20mph.	Mostly northerly, 10 to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.	Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Light showers mostly afternoon Chance showers, risk highest in the afternoon, although also morning not surely dry.	Mostly dry An odd shower possible, but most likely dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear Cloud shrouding the hills in the morning, base slowly lifting, clearing tops by the afternoon but forming to slopes again if showers occur.	Hills clear Perhaps some mist in the morning, soon dissipating.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly cloudy, a few bright spells in the morning. Very good visibility.	Patchwork of sun and clouds. Least sunshine east. Excellent visibility.
Temperature (at 600m)	7 to 10C	10 or 11C
And in the valleys	13C at dawn rising to 15C	9C rising to 17C

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 11 July, 2024

Cool rest of the week. On Thursday light showers, particularly in northern England, southern Scotland and Wales, Highlands mostly dry. Generally improving toward the weekend, locally showers on Friday, wettest in northern Scotland. Low still circulating east of England may bring wet spells on eastern Highlands and Cheviots on both Friday and during the weekend, but western Highlands, Lake District and Pennines should stay mostly dry and get some sun. Again more widespread rain beginning of next week.
