

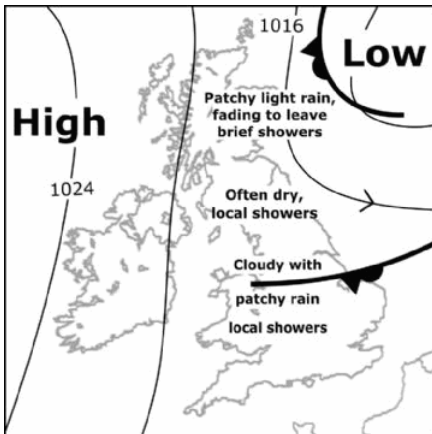
Peak District

General Summary for Thursday, 11 July, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 11 July, 2024

Extensive cloud, more frequent rain in the morning on Snowdon range and in the Cairngorms. Sunny spells likeliest on the western Scottish coast. where cloud may lift during the day above most hills, leaving highest Munros in clouds. Windy on the eastern Highlands. Mostly cool temperatures.

Headline for Peak District

Mostly cloudy, locally showers

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 11 July, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Northeasterly 10 to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showers mostly afternoon Showers possible any time of the day, particularly afternoon when some may be heavy.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Hills frequently cloud free by afternoon Cloud shrouding the hills extensively in the morning, base slowly lifting to 450m perhaps 550m by early or mid afternoon. Cloud base may temporarily drop again near showers, but by late afternoon or evening higher areas are likely to have cleared. 20% slowly rising to 80% late afternoon
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly cloudy only occasional sun. Visibility excellent.
Temperature (at 600m) And in the valleys	7 to 10C 13C at dawn rising to 15C

	Friday 12 July	Saturday 13 July
How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly, 10 to 20mph.	North to northwesterly around 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small effect on walking, but feeling distinctly cool for July on higher exposed moors.	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Mostly light showers Occasional light showers coming in from the northeast, mostly drizzly, perhaps locally a brief steadier shower forming in the afternoon, greater risk extending southwestwards with time.	Mostly dry, risk showers rising afternoon Most of the day dry, perhaps an odd shower. Risk of showers rising toward the evening east of river Derwent. High uncertainty.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear Most or all cloud above the hills, any early patches grazing the highest tops soon lifting. Rare patches returning if showers occur.	Hills likely clearing soon Uncertain, most likely damp and dull by dawn, clearing the hills in the morning or around noon.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun and clouds. Least sunshine east. Excellent visibility.	Patchwork of sun and clouds. Likely very good visibility.
Temperature (at 600m) And in the valleys	9 to 11C. In the breeze, feeling like 3 to 5C on higher terrain. 9C rising to 17C	10 to 12C 11C rising to 16C

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 12 July, 2024**

Extensively dry over the next few days, although with one or two 'shallow' areas of low pressure close to Britain, rain is likely for a few hours in some areas - or sometimes afternoon heavy showers. Generally winds light; some sunshine, but overall fairly extensive cloud. A little less cold.
