

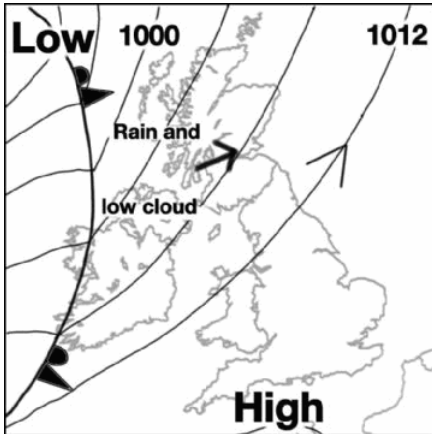
Peak District

General Summary for Friday, 2 August, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 2 August, 2024

Rain and will advance gradually across Scotland from the middle of the day onwards, and in evening reach mountains close to the Irish Sea. There will also be areas of low cloud. Nevertheless, for many areas, including east Scotland extensively dry and warm. Upland wind approaching gale force western Scotland.

Headline for Peak District

Fairly light wind. Chance of a little rain late on.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 2 August, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	South to southwesterly, starting 10 to 15mph, slowly strengthening through the day toward 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely The odd burst of rain almost anywhere later in day.
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Periods of sunshine. Visibility very good, but a haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	17C
And in the valleys	22 to 24C in the afternoon.

Cloud on the hills?	Hills extensively clear An odd cloud patch here and there possible.	Hills extensively clear Little to no cloud on the hills
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain	Almost certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Cloud breaking up to give extensive bright sunshine Visibility excellent.	Sunny start with fair weather clouds, increasingly cloudy through the afternoon. Excellent visibility by afternoon.
Temperature (at 600m)	11 to 14C	15C
And in the valleys	Reaching 19 to 21C in the afternoon.	10C at dawn rising to 19 to 21C

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 3 August, 2024

Low pressure centres, mostly passing northwest of Scotland), and their associated fronts, will intermittently windy and wet conditions next week. Most rainfall will be on western mountains, with considerable rainfall on the W & NW highlands of Scotland. Frequently windy across Scotland. Lowest rainfall will be in eastern Scotland, the southern Pennines and easternmost Wales. Temperature wise warm and very humid on Monday, but through the week generally colder than this week.
