

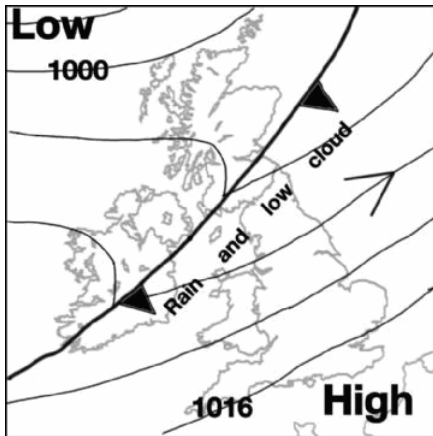
Peak District

General Summary for Thursday, 15 August, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 15 August, 2024

An active front will bring a broad zone of gale or near gale force upland winds, rain and low cloud southwards, although toward the Peak District and south and east Wales, the deterioration will be gradual. Will improve from NW across Scotland, but precise time uncertain.

Headline for Peak District

Upland wind near gale, deteriorating as rain and low cloud approach.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 15 August, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly; 30mph possibly for a few hours 35mph. Slight easing later in day.
Effect of wind on you?	Strenuous walking conditions and considerable wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain tending southwards, most likely middle of day Dry most or all morning, although drizzly rain starting toward Pendle. The rain will become frequent and gradually extend into the Peak District early to mid afternoon, although very little rain at all southern and eastern hills.
Cloud on the hills?	Deteriorating as fog lowers onto the hills Most or all summits free of cloud for a few hours. But through middle of day and afternoon, from north cloud will lower toward 300 to 450m.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Dropping to 20% through middle of day
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun and very good visibility morning, but becoming extensively dull and misty.
Temperature (at 600m)	14C.
And in the valleys	20C, but ahead of the rain possibly briefly 23C some easternmost valleys.

How windy? (On the summits)	Variable, mostly westerly directions, strengthening from 5 to 20mph.	Westerly, mostly 15 to 25mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small, negligible in the morning.	Fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Extensively cloud-free Hills clear.	Hills clearing early Except for morning mist mostly cloud-free.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Frequently sunny, high UV. Very good or excellent visibility.	Mostly sunny. Slight haze in the air.
Temperature (at 600m)	Around 14C.	10 to 13C
And in the valleys	12C at dawn rising to 19-20C.	9 or 10C at dawn, rising to 18C

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 16 August, 2024**

A long run of frequently strong winds (particularly across Scotland) high rainfall and extensive low cloud (focussed on western mountains). There may be one or two drier much less windy periods across Wales and southern Pennines as pressure rises over a few days just to the south of Britain.
