

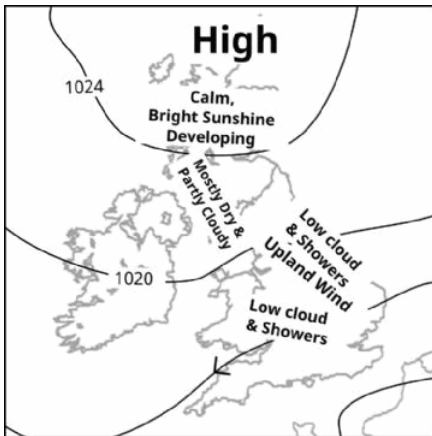
Peak District

General Summary for Wednesday, 2 October, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 2 October, 2024

Sunny and dry in the Highlands, only glens in cloud in the morning. Rare showers in southern Scotland, more frequent in northern England - Lake District shall stay mostly dry, some sun here. Wet & cloudy morning in Peak District and on most Welsh hills, there slowly improving.

Headline for Peak District

Windy and cool, morning showers, cloud slowly breaking

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 2 October, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	East to northeasterly, 25mph, to gusty 35mph on some slopes, near exposed edges and locally downslope to the west.
Effect of wind on you?	Varied, fairly small in places, but expect sudden buffeting gusts, not just on highest terrain. Marked wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Light showers in the morning Spots of light rain on eastern moors in the morning, some drops in the wind reaching western hills. Becoming dry afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Covering higher areas for a time Early morning banks of cloud rolling across the hills, mostly higher and eastern areas above 500-600m, soon lifting above all tops. Breaks soonest in west.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Rising to 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly cloudy, glimpses of sun toward west, perhaps more breaks in clouds in the afternoon. Visibility good, but slight haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	6 to 8C, but feeling sub-zero in the wind.
And in the valleys	9C at dawn, rising to 13C.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 3 October	Friday 4 October
How windy? (On the summits)	East to southerly, 10 to 20mph.	Southerly, 20 to 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.	Blustery, walking impeded on higher terrain, stability beginning to be affected. Marked wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Tops clear, valleys partly under low cloud Patches of fog or very low cloud in some valleys possible especially east of river Derwent, but except for the lower slopes hills likely clear.	Low cloud in valleys, tops likely clear Fog or low cloud in some valleys, tops widely above the cloud. Fog dissipating during the morning.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Lot of sunshine with some fair weather clouds afternoon. Very good visibility.	Morning low cloud in the east and south, later sunny everywhere. Good visibility but slight haze possible.
Temperature (at 600m)	9C	7 to 9C, feeling much colder in wind.
And in the valleys	4-5C at dawn rising to 15C	5C at dawn, rising to 14C

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 3 October, 2024**

Dry and sunny Thursday, on Friday only in western Scotland deteriorating conditions, especially beware of severe winds in Highlands in general. Lowering pressure and southwesterly winds toward the weekend brings an unsettled spell- rain at times, briefly milder air. Likely turning colder again during the weekend onward into early next week. Cold and showery toward next Wednesday.
