




The southernmost Pennines, covering the entire Peak District National Park, also extending north to hills accessed from Hebden Bridge, and including the hills immediately north of Manchester.

General Summary for Tuesday, 29 October, 2024



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 29 October, 2024

Widespread low cloud, mostly dry except for western Scotland and local drizzle on hills near western coasts (Snowdonia, Lake District). Cloud breaking above eastern slopes, letting some sun through. Mostly light winds, breezier on Highlands, in the far north windy. Mild.

Dull, some sun in the east. Dry, light winds, mild

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 29 October, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	West to southwesterly or variable, 10-15mph or less.	
Effect of wind on you?	Small.

Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, lowest west	
	Covering the hills widely, lowest cloud base western areas, but may be foggy widely from lower slopes up in morning. Frequent breaks in east.

Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Grey and dull particularly in west. Toward east, some glimpses of sun especially afternoon and good visibility below cloud.	
Temperature (at 600m)	8 to 11C.

	Low cloud from lower slopes upward, covering most or all hills. During the day cloud slowly thinning, clearing parts of the National Park.	Cloud fairly persistent in the valleys and on most fells. Highest peaks (above 600m) may stay above the clouds at times.
Chance of cloud free summits?	40%	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Weak sunbeams coming through clouds. At start perhaps sunny some tops above cloud. Mostly poor visibility.	Very sunny and excellent visibility if above the cloud. However, most frequent in cloud, murky with poor visibility.
Temperature (at 600m)	9 to 11C	9 to 13C.
And in the valleys	9C at dawn rising to 13C	10 to 14C, rising only a little through the day.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 30 October, 2024

West to southwesterlies prevail with high pressure extending across Britain for rest of the week, keeping dry conditions for most, although some rain may continue to affect northwest Scotland. Low cloud fairly widespread, some fog into valleys, with local inversion conditions developing. On Friday chillier northwesterly air is likely over the Highlands, dropping to freezing over higher Scottish mountains, some showers with snow - elsewhere dry and staying mild. Later back to west and southwesterlies, high pressure shows signs of keeping most of Britain dry until end of next week.
