

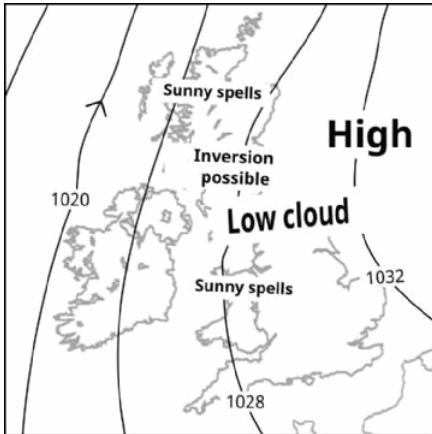
Peak District

General Summary for Thursday, 7 November, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 7 November, 2024

Another widely murky day, with hills often in or just below cloud, damp with local drizzle. Windy in Highlands, some upland gales. Best chances for sun in Snowdonia, in north Lake District and in Northwest Highlands and along Strathspey. Generally mild.

Headline for Peak District

Overcast, murky, poor visibility, dry with moderate breeze

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 7 November, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Southeasterly, 15 to perhaps locally 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Walking becoming strenuous, marked wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Covered extensively Hills widely covered, perhaps down to lowest slopes, fog in the morning possible in the valleys.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast, little to no sun. Visibility mostly poor, often very hazy.
Temperature (at 600m)	Around 7C
And in the valleys	10-11C, almost constant through the day except for areas with some sun.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Friday 8 November	Saturday 9 November
How windy? (On the summits)	South to southeasterly, widely 15 to 20mph, locally 25mph.	Southeasterly, 10-15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small.	Small or negligible.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Rain unlikely
Cloud on the hills?	Mostly extensive, gradually thinning Hills widely covered in cloud almost top to bottom at first. During the day cloud base slowly rising, clearing slopes to perhaps 500-600m. Chance for cloud fully breaking toward Shining Tor.	Covered extensively Cloud on various levels, most likely lower slopes clear but tops and higher slopes covered.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30%	30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Very limited if any sun, most likely western part of NP. Poor visibility, murky or at least very hazy	Very little sun if at all appearing, mostly poor visibility due to extensive cloud and haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	Around 10C.	Around 6C
And in the valleys	8C at dawn, rising to 10 to 14C, warmest west if sun appears.	Between 5 and 9C

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 8 November, 2024

Southerly flow with cloudy and damp weather continues until Sunday, when a cold front from the Atlantic will bring some rain. This passes quickly and will be followed by westerlies bringing more sun beginning of next week. From Monday onward high pressure centres over the UK, sunnier and warmer conditions with hardly any rain are expected until Thursday, when another front will bring some rain and again cooler air. Unclear for next weekend, but high pressure, dry conditions are most likely.
