




The southernmost Pennines, covering the entire Peak District National Park, also extending north to hills accessed from Hebden Bridge, and including the hills immediately north of Manchester.

General Summary for Wednesday, 13 November, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 13 November, 2024

Mix of sun and often very low clouds covering the hills. In Highlands most sunshine afternoon, in Peak District and south Wales sunny most of the day. Southern Pennines and Lakes much sunnier than northern parts. Mild, light winds, chance for inversion conditions on the Munros.

Headline for Peak District

Dry and sunny, hardly any clouds, mild

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 13 November, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Northwesterly 15 to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any
	Patches of clouds possible along the western hills, but most often clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%
Sunshine?	Long spells of sunshine.
Air clarity (below cloud)	Good visibility but hazy.
Temperature (at 600m)	8C.
And in the valleys	Local ground frost valleys at first.
	Will reach around 8-10C mid afternoon.

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	High uncertainty in forecast: Northeasterly, mostly 20 to 25mph, but speeds varying through the day. Small.	Westerly, 20 to 25mph widely, at times perhaps 30mph. Mostly small, at times becoming blustery and starting to affect comfortable walking.
How wet?	No rain expected	Rain unlikely
(Precipitation and its impact)		Occasional shower possible, but most likely everywhere dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Variable	Patchy cloud here and there
	Hills often below the cloud, but higher tops may be covered. Patches of cloud building on different altitudes, covering the hills at times on various levels.	First half of the day hills mostly clear, with some cloud patches in depressions mostly. Toward the evening cloud thickening, starting to cover the hills widely.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60%	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sunshine, but sky mostly covered by clouds. Often poor to moderate visibility with general haze.	Cloudy, below the clouds often hazy, moderate visibility.
Temperature (at 600m)	4 to 6C	Around 7C
And in the valleys	Down to 7C in the morning, rising to 9-10C, up to 12C in western dales.	6-7C at dawn rising to max. 11C.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 14 November, 2024

High pressure lasting until Friday, ending with a cold front coming from the northwest, what marks the end of fairly dry and mild period. On Saturday, the front will pass over Britain, reaching central England by the end of the day. bringing some rain to most hilly areas. Drastic cooling and big pressure drop behind the front. On Sunday and start of next week, in low pressure, frequent showers are expected, with snow on the hills, snowflakes even down to valleys and towns. In the Highlands snow may reach significant depths rapidly, meaning truly winter conditions fairly early in the season.
